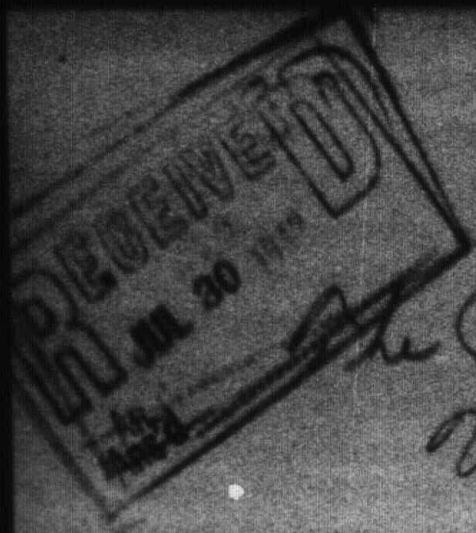

The chattels declared by both these people and also those subsequently declared in the letter from Mr. Yoneda in File #4229, are all accounted for by being stored in our warehouses or left in House #9 at the Pacific Coast Cannery. One complete generator was taken by the Navy and a Victor eleven tube radio set was left in the care of the Kelly Piano Co.

Also appearing on file #4229 is a chattel list #73 in the name of Hiroshi Yoneda taken from House #9, Pacific Coast Cannery to Storage Warehouse #2.

In a letter dated November 6th, 1942 on File #4229, Mrs. Yoneda states that her chattels were in the house of Mr. Asajiro Mase? Mr. and Mrs. Mase declare that all their chattels were stored at #2 Road, Steveston in the care of Mr. Yoshida who on evacuation rented his house to a Mr. Hanna.

There is no way of knowing to whom the chattels on List #73 belong as many Japanese stored their belongings at House #9, Pacific Coast Cannery, but it seems clear that they did not belong to the Yoshidas.

Dear Sir:

This Office has now completed the final summary of your affairs that were vested in the Custodian and we are, accordingly, enclosing a cheque for \$1,369.51. This amount represents your final credit balance.

From time to time you have been advised in regards to the administration of your affairs and this now being completed, it is felt that you would appreciate being supplied with a final financial statement and also a brief summary.

As you are aware, the policies in regard to the management and subsequent liquidation of your property were decided upon by the Government of Canada, and while the problem was a difficult one for all concerned, we can assure you that it has been the aim of this Office to carry out these policies in as careful and fair a manner as possible.

With reference to the liquidation of the property, it should be pointed out that this was in line with the general policy covering all types of property, including many that were substandard and required considerable upkeep. With reference to your property in particular, it was sold to the Department of Veterans' Land Affairs for \$1,277.00.

In addition to that amount your account was credited with the refunds of Fire Insurance and Water Rates being, \$10.75, December 21, 1943, and \$11.00, August 10, 1944, respectively. Against that of course, were the costs of legal fees, \$15.00, registration fees, \$3.00, and a Certificate of Encumbrance, \$1.00. It has been already noted that you have been advised of the proceeds resulting from the auctioning of chattels.
