PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

CHATTELS: The above made his declaration to the Custodian on April 15, 1942 and was evacuated on November 10, 1942. He declared a few household effects as shown on the Chattel Schedule on file, left in a six room house at the Celtic Cannery, where he was living with his wife, Akino. We must assume that the Cannery moved these goods or had the above move the goods before evacuation, to the Celtic Cannery School house which was used as a storage warehouse, as the file reveals that on July 4, 1944 Custodian Agent Mr. G. M. Harris inventoried effects in the name of Mrs. A. Yasuda, wife of the above, as per list #11. This list was placed on the file of the above and sales were credited to his account as Mrs. Yasuda (File 8510) signed a yellow no property card on May 9, 1942.

The file reveals that on May 26, 1943, Custodian agent Mr. C. C. Robinson sold to F. Clugston, Manager of the Celtic Cannery, 114' of hose in 6 pieces tagged with the name A. YASUDA for the sum of \$4.56, which amount was credited to the account of the above with this office. The goods removed to our auction room on July 4, 1944 have been sold for the net sum of \$102.14 and this credited to the account of the above.

SPECIFIED ARTICLES:

A fishing vessel, the "T.Y." was sold to R. Williams by the above for the sum of \$925.00 prior to the outbreak of war with Japan. Full particulars are given on Specified Articles Summary of February 21, 1945, on file.

MONEYS

RECEIVABLE: In July 1945, the account of the above was credited with 0.89 being a refund of B. C. Electric Ry. Co. Ltd., Security Deposit for light.

BANK

ACCOUNT: The above declared having an account of \$500.00 in the Bank of Montreal, Hastings and Main St. branch. This did not come under the control of the Custodian.

LIFE

INSURANCE: The above declared having a \$500.00 policy with the Monarch Life Assurance Co., the beneficiary being his wife Akino YASUDA. This did not come under the control of the Custodian.

Dear Mrs. Watson:—

Received your letter sometimes ago but was unable to answer sooner because I had to talk it over with my parents at home.

About that sewing machine — you mean the one that was in your son's room isn't it? Yes, that machine is ours and since it's you that's wanting it, we will let you have it for 25 dollars. We will make it as reasonable as we can because we are asking you again to send us some more of our things, <sup>which are a lot of things</sup> Mrs. Watson you can economize a lot if you can make clothes by yourself, isn't it, and also a machine comes in very handy in many other ways.

We still have quite a lot of our belongings that haven't we? And owing to the inconveniences of keeping things and the lack of everything out here in the country we want to ask you again to send us a few household goods. Would you please look in the boxes and send all the kitchen needs such as cups and saucers, big and small dishes, glasses, aluminum pots and pans, kettles etc. <sup>(all kitchen utensils)</sup> In between these fragile things, well

you put in "sheeps wool" (it's in couple of white bags (black)) for it will keep the dishes from breaking. If there are some wool left after stuffing the chinaware, will you send the rest over too? And we want the big electric gramophone and the records too. (They're mostly Japanese) They are about the only entertainment for the old people here who doesn't understand English very well. Father would also like to get the pictures of our relatives which are in big frames. There's a couple of them and I hope you can find them. And would you also send about 2 big wicker boxes. I think they're full of cushions and curtains and things like that but it really doesn't have to be the same one because there's so many of those boxes, so pick out the larger boxes will you please? While looking for these things, if you come across umbrellas will you shove it in with something too. And that machine cover that's on the sewing machine - mother wants it for ours so will you put that in too?

You can stuff as many things in the boxes if you can because we ~~can~~ can use anything and are in need of everything here.

That's about all ~~of~~ for our family but the Kdachi's would like to have few things too. They like you to send the cushions and photo's



which are to be found in the white 5 drawered bureau, and also from the varnished cupboard a roasting pan, a frying pan, 2 aluminum pots and a wooden tray.

For freight and the other expenses, will you pay it out of the \$25 (cost of machine) In case that amount is not enough to cover the expenses, please let us know.

After you send all these things, I suppose the store room will be quite vacant compared to the time I went on track won't it, Mrs. Watson? I could just about imagine for most of it was ours. There's still some furniture and other things left but the rest that's left, I know you'll keep good care.

I sincerely hope all of you are in the best of health. Our family sends their best regards to all.


