Mrs. Kariya was sent a list of chattels left in care of Mr. J.R. Martin and chattels stored and she signed same stating that some of the remaining chattels belonged to Takeo Sakai and Kuranosuke Hashimoto. We wrote, 19/4/42, to Mrs. Kariya stating the goods left in her house by SAKAI but received no



SEARCHED Bureau with mirror

SEARCHED as that no comparison has been made between the stored goods and signed for and the original list.

SEARCHED 1 - plain 3-drawer bureau (no mirror) was shipped to Mrs. Burdette which she stated was not hers. It was sold for \$4.00 and her eye examination this would be one of the bureaus.

1 - Bureau with mirror was shipped to Mrs. Burdette in Feb. 1943 - presumably this is one of the bureaus with mirror.

Of the above goods stored the file shows that articles listed below are claimed to be owned by the respective individuals:

MEMORANDUM To File 4151

March 15, 1946.

From: F. Matheson

Sgt. Tokuro SAKAI

This man originally declared that he had left his chattels at his former residence. He lists household and furniture effects, kitchen utensils, etc. No chattels were found at his former residence, and on April 13, 1944, he informed us that his remaining chattels were stored at the home of Yone KARIYA, File 697. These were one bureau with mirror, 5 sets of Japanese dolls, one box of chinaware. The 5 sets of Japanese dolls may possibly be the 5 boxes of dolls, pictures, papers, etc. which according to memo on File 697 were discarded when the chattels were removed from the home of Mrs. KARIYA. File No. 697 throws no light at this date on the disposition of this man's chattels.
