

Regarding the two boats and two engines shown on JP, what appears to be the same two boats and the Johnson engine were declared by Hironobu MORIYAMA, File 6524, son of Ujiro.

These two boats and the Johnson engine have been sold and the proceeds credited to Hironobu MORIYAMA.

There is no record of a Neptune engine belonging to either Ujiro or Hironobu MORIYAMA being in the hands of the B.C. Police at Ocean Falls, or in the hands of Naval Service.


Some time ago, Mr. Bell took up with me the question relative to two boats at Ocean Falls belonging to Ujiro Moriyama, registered number, 11476, your file 4160 of September 22nd. I regret that this letter was inadvertently filed without reply.

Our records show a speed boat belonging apparently to this man, and registered by us as Ocean Falls #5, was sold on July 10th for \$50.00; and another small boat also apparently belonging to this man, and known by us as Ocean Falls #20, was sold on May 16th for \$20.00. Both of these prices were those estimated as being the current value, by our surveyor. These amounts are included in our ledger folio, 619A, which I am quoting in case you have occasion to refer to them later on.

Our information is that a number of engines belonging to these Ocean Falls boats were taken by Naval Authority to Esquimalt. I have the matter of the disposition made of them in hand, and shall advise your office thereon as soon as I have more information.

We have sold two boats and one Johnson Outboard 24 HP Motor. These were reported to be the property of H. Moriyama, of Ocean Falls, and the proceeds have been placed in Hironobu MORIYAMA's Account provisionally. The net proceeds are approximately \$170.00.

We wrote both Ujiro MORIYAMA and Hironobu MORIYAMA on August 5, 1943, asking if these articles were owned jointly, but we have received no reply. Would you kindly have Ujiro MORIYAMA interviewed and ask him whether he or his son owns the two boats and the Johnson Outboard.

You might advise Mr. MORIYAMA that we have no record of the Neptune Outboard he declared, and ask him to supply whatever information he may have in regard to this.
