CHATTEL SUMMARY

In his declaration of April 15, 1942, Tomograki Doi declared 8 fishing nets at the imperial Cannery Net House, Steveston, B. C. At the request of the Custodian Tomograki forwarded an itemized list of nets, which was received on February 22, 1943. On this list he shows 10 nets, instead of the original 8 nets, as declared originally, and additional cork and lead lines.

Our memo of March 13, 1946, taken from the record books received from the B. G. Packers Ltd., (Imperial Cennery) will show the nets entered into this book by Tomoyuki Doi as being left in this company's net house. This list shows only 8 nets, but does show the cork and lead lines.

The Net Statement of warch 6, 1944, will show the disposition of nets found by the Custodian. Although nets, Nos. 263, 263B and 249, were inventoried in the net house by the Custodian, there is no record of what happened to these items.

Tomoyuki Doi did not declare any other chattels in the Protected area and the file reveals that none were found in his name.

TOMOTUKI DOX, the claimant herein, being first duly sworn, testified through the Interpreter as follows:

MR. VIRTUE: It might shorten things a little your H enour, if I made a statement before I began to examine the claimant. I'l could see the bill of sale of the boat, if my learned friend has it. The boat is supposed to have been sold by the Japanese Pishing Vessels Disposal Committee on 10 April 15th, 1942.
