Dear Sir & Madam:

On January 18th, 1944, we removed from the Catholic Mission at Steveston, 1 complete bed and spring, tagged with the name of "Shizue NISHIMURA". This bed was sold for the net amount of \$6.38 and the proceeds were credited to her account.

As this young girl is your daughter and did not declare any property in the protected area, will you please let us know if she is entitled to receive this amount. You both declared three beds and other goods when you made your declaration to the Custodian in April 1942. Would the bed and spring referred to above be one of the beds declared by either one of you?

We might mention that we have had no reply from you to our letters of July 17th and November 23rd, 1943.

Will you kindly let us have a prompt reply to this letter so that we may know who is entitled to the \$6.38 at present credited to the account of Shizue NISHIMURA.
