



PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

CHATELS:

The above, who made his declaration to the Custodian on April 15/42 and was evacuated on April 26/42, declared no property of any kind whatsoever. Nevertheless the file reveals that on January 19/43 his account was credited with the sum of \$196.50, being the proceeds from sale of nets and lines found in #1 Konda Net House and sold to the Imperial Cannery. We wrote to him on March 12/43 about the ownership of this equipment and enclosed a net form for him to fill. We received this back from him on March 22/43 duly completed showing list of nets he had left at the Imperial Cannery net house. On January 20/44 his account was credited with the sum of \$5.00, being selling price of 50 fa. of lead line, being transferred from the account of his father to the account of Hiroshi as the father declared no nets. See memo from Miss Seaton to Accounting Dept. of Jan. 20/44.

All nets found by the Custodian at the #1 net house of the Imperial Cannery, tagged with the name of the above, were inventoried by Custodian agent, Mr. C. C. Robinson, and given Custodian numbers as shown on Net Statement of Jan. 20/44 on file. Net bearing Custodian number 303 is missing. This may have been sold and funds credited to Net Suspense Account on account of the tag being torn off, or it may have been abandoned as of no saleable value. The others as mentioned before were sold for the sum of \$196.50 plus \$5.00, making a total of \$201.50 as shown on Net Statement, and this total sum credited to the above.

The above wrote to us on April 9/45 enquiring about some effects he had stored in the house of Mosaburo TERAGUCHI, File 1590. The effects from this house were inventoried by Custodian agent, Mr. G. M. Haxis on March 4 and 11, 1944, List #479, on File 1590, in the name of M. TERAGUCHI. One bed and spring found on this list marked with the name of the above was sold at auction for the net sum of \$7.18 and this sum was credited to his account with the Custodian. A carton of records which sold for the net sum of \$.42 was also credited to his account. A gramophone, which had been inventoried on June 15/42 at Imperial Cannery House #6 in the name of Kichisaburo MORISHITA, the father of the above, but later identified as belonging to Hiroshi as it had his name on it, was sold for the sum of \$1.38, and this sum credited to the account of the above.

SPECIFIED
ARTICLES:

According to information supplied to this office the above was the registered owner of a fishing vessel the "Jeanette" which was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee for the net sum of \$690.50. Of this amount, the sum of \$545.92 was paid to the B.C. Packers Ltd. on April 29/42 to satisfy a chattel mortgage and the balance of \$144.58 was paid to the above. Full details are given on Specified Articles Summary on file.

WAR SAVINGS
CERTIFICATES: The above declared one \$5.00 War Savings Certificate in his own possession. This did not come under the control of the Custodian.

On April 24/45 a Custodian cheque in the sum of \$201.50, being the total proceeds from sale of his nets and lines, was remitted to the above. His balance now stands at \$8.96 and a Custodian cheque for this sum will be

remitted to him in the course of the next few days.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.

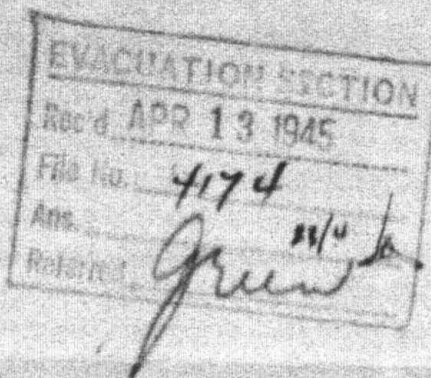

Dear Sir:-

In answer to yours of April 9th, we are sending to you herewith a statement of those of your nets that we have been able to find and sell. You will see that the total received is \$201.50 and we are enclosing our cheque for this sum.

We regret that we have no record of the net that is shown as unaccounted for and in this connection should mention that the Steveston Canneries have refused to accept any responsibility for Japanese-owned nets left on their premises. In your case, our difficulties were increased by the fact that you did not declare any nets when you registered your assets with the Custodian on April 15th, 1942, and it was not until March 1943 that we received particulars of your equipment.

Turning to your other effects, we cannot trace receiving any letters from you of what you left behind though you say you have sent two already. Here again you did not declare any effects to us when you registered and anything found in Mr. Kosaburo Teraguchi's house has, for the most part, been sold and credited to his account. However, we are working on this matter and will have something to advise you further in due course.

I will put down the list of things I've left and also the net. I was ever so glad to receive the money which you had sent me. There's still one net left which you stated you hadn't sold it yet. If it is please send the money too.

fit.

3 steel beds & springs.
1 dresser

I've also written about
the Japanese records. Won't
you look over for them tho?

Thank you for your letter of March 20th, 1946, in which you list the things you left with Mr. Mosaburo TERAGUCHI.

We note that in a letter of January 16th, 1945, from your father, he lists the same items. Of these, the following were credited to him as they were found to be marked with the initial "K":

- 1 Round table
- 1 Bed and spring
- 1 Dresser

One bed and spring marked with the initial "H" were credited to your account.

A carton of Japanese records has since been sold and the proceeds credited to the account of M. TERAGUCHI. We have written to Miss Sakie TERAGUCHI about this and if she agrees that the records belonged to you, we will transfer the funds to your account.

Regarding the lamp stand, will you please describe it a little more fully as we are in doubt as to what you mean exactly. Is it a standard lamp or just a stand for a lamp?

There is no change to record in connection with your nets since our letter of April 24th, 1945, when we enclosed our cheque for \$201.50. In the record book of the Imperial Cannery net house in which you entered the nets left by you in their net house, the net, 4/40x6x50 - 200 - is scored out, which would make it appear that you had disposed of this net yourself. This is the net marked "Unaccounted for" in our statement and it did not come into our possession.

Describing the lamp stand, it is a "Twilight lamp" with 3 candle arms, twilight bulb of 100, 200, 300 watts and a shade of rayon. Orange colour.

There should be one more brown steel bed & spring. Kindly please find it out.

Sometimes last year, Mr. Deraguchi wrote me that the Custodian should have sent us the money for the things but we only received the money for the 3 nets and nothing else. A letter from the Custodian stated that they have sold 3 nets but not the other. So when they sell it later they will send me the money. We will write to Mr. Deraguchi again for the records too.

Thank you for your letter of April 1st describing the lamp stand about which we wrote you on March 26th, 1946.

A review of the file of Mr. Mosaburo TERAGUCHI reveals that no trilight lamp was found or moved from his house by the Custodian at any time, nor was one inventoried by our Stevenson representative on April 20th, 1942.

Only two beds were found in this house when the goods were moved to our storage warehouse on March 4th, 1944. One of these was credited to your account and the other to your father's account.

We have heard from Miss Sakie TERAGUCHI and she agrees that the carton of records belongs to you, so we are crediting your account with the proceeds from their sale.

Regarding the nets, we have nothing to add to our letter of April 24th, 1945, as we still have no record of the net shown as unaccounted for in the statement sent to you at that time.

Enclosed please find Custodian cheque in the sum of \$8.98, being your entire credit balance with this office, and we are accordingly closing your file.

Your file has been reviewed and it is noted that when you made your declaration to the Custodian on April 15th, 1942, you declared no chattels whatsoever. Nevertheless nets and lines found in the Imperial Cannery net house tagged with your name were sold for the total sum of \$201.50, and a cheque for this amount was remitted to you on April 24th, 1945.

Certain goods were found in Imperial Cannery House #6 and inventoried by the Custodian in the name of your father, Kichisaburo MORISHITA. Among these effects was a gramophone which was marked with your name. It was sold for the net sum of \$1.38 and this amount was credited to your account with the Custodian. A bed and a carton of records were found in the house of Mossaburo TERAGUCHI tagged with your name.
