

Having to go to Annicis Island Wednesday, I could not return to Westham island till thursday. When I arrived, I found that all places where I hadn't tagged chattels had been broken into and most of the valuable chattels stolen.

I im inquired but couldn't get any satisfactory information.

By the looks of some of the scattered remnents, I would say that

a large amount of valuable chattels have been stolen.

The people living on the Island say that for some time their have been fishermen going through the buildings and helping themselves. I don't agree, and think that a large portion of the chattels might be found on the island in some of the homes.

Although you and other inhabitants of Westham Island advise that the constant pilfering that has taken place from these premises is the work of passing fishermen, we now believe from reports received by our fieldmen that the local residents have been at least to some extent, responsible. We have reported this matter to the Ladner Police.

When the writer visited this place on April 5th, 1943, there was nothing left of any value and although articles belonging to other Japanese were moved to safe storage, there was nothing found for these Japanese which justified moving.
