Nets found tagged with the name of the above at the Brunswick Cannery net house were sold for the total sum of \$210.00. Only three nets instead of the six declared by him were found. The three that were sold were sold direct by the Custodian to the cannery.

The carpenter tools he declares are probably the same tools that were shipped to his brother Yukio on March 27/44, as there is no mention of any tools being found in the name of the above.

A band saw was sold at Steveston auction #20 for the net sum of \$43.16, and this was originally credited to the account of Yukio, but as Yukio did not declare this and the above did declare a machine saw, we have transferred this credit to the account of Yukinori TAKASAKI.

The lumber was sold for the sum of \$40.00 and this was also credited to the account of Yukio, but as he did not declare any lumber and Yukinori did, this has also been transferred to the account of Yukinori TAKASAKI.

We have received a letter from Mr. Jacobson of the Brunswick Cannery stating that he has the following goods belonging to the above and asks that we have these goods shipped to the above as Mr. TAKASAKI has requested them:

a kitchen stove
3 piece bedroom suite
2 radio tables
a lamp table
an occasional chair

SPECIFIED ARTICLES:

The above ~~apparently owned a fishing vessel~~ ^{declared} a fishing boat engine which he ~~declared~~ as a fishing vessel licensed in his name was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee for the net sum of \$888.50 and this sum was paid to the above through his Attorney, U. SAKAMOTO, on May 19/42. Full details are given on Specified Articles Summary on file.

VICTORY BOND:

The above declared a \$50.00 Victory Bond in his own possession. This was not brought under the control of the Custodian.

LIFE INSURANCE:

The above declared an insurance policy with the Sun Life Assurance Co. in the sum of \$1000.00, his brother Yukio being the beneficiary. He also declared a policy with the Monarch Life Insurance Co. in the sum

of \$1500.00 the beneficiary being his wife, Hisako. It would seem that in giving us this information he confused the beneficiaries as a cash surrender cheque was received from the Sun Life Co. made out jointly to the above and his wife, whereas he had given us his brother as the beneficiary of this policy. This cheque was remitted to Yukinori TAKASAKI on Nov. 23/43.


MONEYS
RECEIVABLE:

On Aug. 21/42 we received from the Home Oil Distributors a cheque in the sum of \$40.00 in favour of the above and this sum was credited to his account with this office. The letter enclosing this cheque did not say what this sum represented, but apparently was a credit standing to his account with the Home Oil Distributors.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.
