Kashiro AKAI declared certain chattels on April 15, 1942 (see Chattel Schedule) and was not evacuated from the protected area until August 24, 1942. The Sustodian did remove certain chattels (see Chattel Schedule) on July 9, 1942 to the warehouse and also left a number of chattels (see Chattel Schedule) in the care of the tenant, Mr. Gallagher, for which he signed. The list of chattels which were taken to the warehouse and the list of chattels which were left with the tenant were signed for by Kashiro AKAI on December 5, 1942 and at the same time he sent in an additional list of chattels (see Chattel Schedule). AKAI claims that the additional list were of items stored in the house and not included in either of the lists he signed. Mr. Robinson, The Custodian's agent, was requested to check on this additional alist and in a memo dated February 5, 1943 he stated that Mr. Gallagher had in his possession items for which he did not sign for (see Chattel Schedule).

After the sale of the property, The Custodian removed chattels held by Mr. Gallagher. Them appeared to be a shortage and on questioning Mr. Gallagher he stated that AKAI had taken most of his effects with him. This can be true as AKAI did not leave this area until August and Gallagher was in possession of this house in July.

The Gustodian suctioned all saleable goods (see Chattel Schedule). Certain goods declared by AKAI were never found by the Custodian, such as two sewing machinese. Goods inventoried by the Custodian but never auctioned, we must assume were discarded as having no saleable value.
