

This file reveals the above owned no real property in any protected area of B.C., and did not carry any Fire Insurance.

CHATELS: The above, who made his declaration to the Custodian on April 15/42 declared only fishing nets and lines, at the Gulf of Georgia Cannery net house. These were inventoried by Custodian agent, J.D.Mather, at the Gulf of Georgia Cannery net house on May 19/42 and sold for the total sum of \$504.50, and this sum credited to the account of the above with this office. A Custodian cheque for this sum was remitted to the above on Aug. 8/44.

The above claimed ownership of House #40, built on Gulf of Georgia property, to be his own. This was confirmed by the company in their letter of May 13/42, in which they also express their intention of allowing their white help to use this house, and state that the company does not intend paying the Japanese rent for this house, but if this arrangement was not agreeable, the house would have to be removed.

Although the above did not originally declare household goods, he wrote to us on Oct. 10/44 and gave a list of goods he had left at the house of M. OGA, who had lived on 6th Ave. Steveston. The goods from this house had been inventoried in the name of M. OGA, so this list was checked with the list of goods the above declared he had left there, and articles that could be specifically identified as belonging to NAKATA were transferred from the file of OGA to the account of the above. The net proceeds from sale of these goods was \$47.61, and a Custodian cheque for this sum was remitted to the above on Dec. 28/44. This includes \$10.00 less \$2.50 appraisal fee, for a stove sold direct to a Mrs. Johnson.

SPECIFIED ARTICLES: According to information supplied to this office the above was the registered owner of a fishing vessel the "T.N." which was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for the net sum of \$740.00 and this was paid to the above through his attorney, U. SAKAMOTO. Full details are given on Specified Articles Summary on file. He was also the registered owner of a fishing vessel the "Camenita" which was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee for the net sum of \$6826.00. From this sum, \$5.00 was paid to Williams & Rae at the request of the vendor, and the sum of \$368.00 was deducted for repairs on the vessel at the time it was requisitioned, and the balance in the sum of \$6453.00 was paid to NAKATA on Nov. 27/42.

VICTORY BOND:

The above declared a \$100.00 Victory Bond in his own possession. This was not brought under the control of the Custodian.

ACCOUNT: The above declared two savings accounts, one in the Royal Bank of Canada at Steveston in the sum of \$1909.81 and one with the Royal Bank of Canada, Main and Hastings Branch, Vancouver, in the sum of \$6700.00. These were not brought under the control of the Custodian.



Dear Sir:

We thank you for your letter of October 10th, inquiring about some chattels not registered with the Custodian and stored in the house of Makitaro OGA.

On reviewing Mr. Oga's file we find that he makes no mention of having anyone's goods stored in his house other than his own. The house he owned at the corner of 6th & Broadway was rented by Tom King on September 13/42, but was broken into and some goods stolen while it was still vacant. It was boarded up later. The house was sold on June 23/44, and we moved all the chattels found therein to our auction rooms where they were sold - the proceeds all being credited to Mr. Oga.

Some of the items mentioned in your list of household utensils such as bedsteads and springs, 2 wickerwork chairs, round dining-room table, Japanese Tea Set and platters, and chinaware etc. appear on the inventory of goods moved and sold, but as Oga declares many of the same kind of articles, we have no way of identifying your goods.

To enable us to assist you, you will first have to ask Mr. Oga to write and confirm to us that you had your goods stored in his house. When we receive this confirmation, we will send you both a list of the items sold and then you will have to decide between you what amount of the proceeds should be credited to your account.


