The above Japanese own no land but do declare ownership of a 12 room two storey house and a 2 room house built on land belonging to Kiemon YOSHIOKA, File 7373, father of Kazuo (Kazuo changed his name from YOSHIOKA to TAMURA at time of marriage to perpetuate the surname of wife). Actually the property is that of his brother, Asao, File 10660.

Although written to on October 27, 1944, and July 11, 1945, (the father was also written to on December 9th, 1942) informing them that it would be necessary to obtain the father's acknowledgment of ownership, nothing has been received by this office to that effect and they make no reference to the matter whatsoever.

The value of the dwellings is therefore being carried in the property owner's account and distribution is being left to be made between themselves. See letters October 17th, 1946 and November 15th, 1946.

CHATELS: Mrs. TAMURA (File No. 4224) declared a quantity of chattels when registering with this office on the 11th April, 1942. Her husband was evacuated on the 24th February, 1942, and she, on the 16th April 1942. Our fieldmen inventoried the chattels on the 13th October, 1942 and although they made note that the house had been broken into the Japanese acknowledged that our inventory was correct.

In accordance with the policy of liquidation our fieldmen removed all the chattels on the property to sale by auction on the 16th Dec 1943, from which the net sum of \$105.03 was derived.

The Japanese also advised that they had left some chattels with a friend in Pitt Meadows. These were checked and on the 12th June, 1945, their sewing machine was sold by appraisal to the people looking after the chattels, for the net sum of \$67.50, and the balance was sold by auction for the net sum of \$20.27. These funds were credited to the account as received.

Of the chattels inventoried a great quantity were abandoned as not being worth handling.

The proceeds of the first auction were remitted on the 11th October, 1945 at their request to them jointly.


ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE: The Provincial Income Tax Department refunded \$11.44 to the husband's credit on the 8th May, 1943. This was forwarded to him on the 11th August, 1943.

The B.C. Electric Railway Company refunded the sum of \$4.24 to his credit being his security deposit with them. This was forwarded to him on the 11th October, 1945.

LIFE INSURANCE: The husband declared having a Sun Life Insurance policy, but this was not brought under control by the Custodian.

Neither of these files reveals any other Personal Property assets.

I checked HIRASHIMA'S file and he declares certain chattels left in his house which belong to the TAMURAS but there is no further record of same on his file. According to HIRASHIMA'S file no chattels have been sold

Mr. Anderson states on Personal Property Summary:
"Of the chattels inventoried a great quantity were abandoned as not being worth handling." No signed statement on file of chattels abandoned. This, however, may account for the mattresses, window blinds, books etc., claimed.

Dear Sir:

We acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 1st February, and would advise you that balance of funds amounting to \$87.77 derived from sale of chattels, was sent to you on the 15th May, 1947.

With regard to the sale of your houses built on property registered in the names of your brother and father, it will be necessary for you to contact your father and brother re the distribution of the funds credited to them from sale of property registered in their names.

Your father received the sum of \$1335.75 being net proceeds from sale of his property, and we are holding \$1820.21 to the credit of your brother from sale of his property. Please contact your father and brother and come to some agreement between yourselves as to what proportion of these funds belong to you. Your father will have to make settlement with you direct, and your brother's proportion of settlement will be forwarded to you from balance held to his credit at this office.

Please be assured that distribution of these funds amongst yourselves will in no way prejudice your claims which are now being heard before the Commission, as the Honourable Mr. Justice H.I. Bird, Commissioner, has so ruled.



Replying to your letter of the 18th instant we attach hereto copies of statements of accounts of Kasuo and Mrs. Tamura, together with Auction sheets and Memorandum of sale covering all chattels sold by the Custodian.

We cannot understand how you arrived at \$234.50 since the total nett credits of both accounts only equal \$212.88, and the gross total of sales \$253.83, and total charges are \$40.95 leaving a nett credit of \$212.88 as above.

We think this information will answer your purpose but if there is anything further you require please advise us.
