This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 15, 1942 in which he reported that he owned no property of any kind in the protected area.

However, the R.C.M.P. handed to this office a G. E. mantel radio and a Baby Brownie camera which had been surrendered by this man. The radio was sold and the net proceeds in the amount of \$20.75 were credited to the account of this man. The camera was released to him on April 27, 1943.

On December 4, 1944 we requested that KOSUGI send in his radio receipt so that funds could be remitted to him but we received no reply.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

I understand my 1939 Dodge truck, Serial No. 8921080, Detachment Seizure No. T94, Custodians File No. 3845, 1942 License No. CX725, has been sold.

I could not write you sooner as you notified my father, Uzo Kosugi in Slocan, in whom my truck was registered. I received word only recently.

Before this vehicle was sold, the B.C. Security Commission was using it for hauling equipment for the Manning Pool in Hastings Park.

I had been expecting the B.C. Security Commission to make me some arrangement for using it, but instead I have been shocked to hear no such arrangement has been arranged and instead I have been charged administrative expenses of \$25.43

You, yourself know any vehicle in use is reduced in value, so I am requesting you to notify the proper authorities and see that I receive a proper settlement.

The Commission has neglected to notify you on this matter so, you being responsible for such

matters, I request you settle this matter and
notify me immediately.
