Rot. Tour Agreement with Oblate Fathers, Sechalt, B. C.

In a letter dated October 23rd, the Nov. H. P. Dunlop, Principal of Sochelt Perincipal School, expressed the desire of the Oblate Pathers to be relieved of their obligations under the Agreement made with you on the 25th Hey, 1922.

In replying to this letter we adviced the Oblate Pathers that the Deminion Covernment's policy of Liquidation of evacuae essets in the protected areas of british Columbia was being carried out by: (1) shipment of personal property to essere, at such ester's expense, where this was practical and so desired; (2) sale by suction, not proceeds being credited to comer's account; (3) sale on the basis of qualified independent appraisals, not proceeds being credited to comer's account; and he was informed that this office had no objection to the Oblate Fathers following the same procedure, after consulting yous

Some of the personal property included in above list was of little value to start with, and the normal process of wear and tear will have accounted for much acre, but there doubtless remains some articles with a saleable value and the Oblate Fathers should now liquidate these, as cutlined above, in order that the net proceeds may be made available to the proper party or parties and these accounts closed.
