DECLARATION AS TO LOSS OF RADIO RECEIPT

CANADA

TO WIT:

} IN THE MATTER OF A receipt for radio owned
} by Tame OGAKI, formerly of Hillcrest, B. C.,

I, Tame OGAKI, formerly of Hillcrest, B. C., Logger, do solemnly declare:

1. That I owned a Sparton Mantel Radio, Serial No. 970279, and have personal knowledge of the facts herein declared.
2. That I had in my possession and control at Hillcrest, B. C. a Sparton Mantel Radio, Serial No. 970279.
3. On the 12th day of March, 1942, Keizo TATEISHI, acting on my behalf, delivered the said radio to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and obtained a receipt therefor.
4. That I have made a most diligent search for the said receipt in all repositories where such receipt might be. I have not found the same and I verily believe that the said receipt has been lost beyond recovery or destroyed.
5. That I have not in any way dealt with the said receipt or papers relating to the said radio and have not pledged or hypothecated the same or lodged the receipt with any person, firm or corporation as security.
6. That the sole reason for the non-production of the receipt is that it has been lost or accidentally destroyed.
7. That I have been informed that my radio has been sold for the net sum of \$11.99.
8. That I, Tame OGAKI, the owner, am therefore now entitled to the proceeds of such sale, amounting to \$11.99.

AND I make this solemn declaration, conscientiously believing it to be true and knowing that it is of the same force and effect as if made under oath and by virtue of the Canada Evidence Act.
