GENERAL SUMMARY

Re: Shizuka TAJIRI - Reg. No. 13454

The above Japanese declared no assets or liabilities.

According to the records of the Pacific Co-operative Union, Mrs. TAJIRI was the registered owner of \$670.00 worth of Pacific Co-operative Union non-redeemable shares and \$390.00 worth of redeemable shares. These latter are listed as follows:-

1937 shares	\$60.00
1938 shares	80.00
1939 shares	90.00
1940 shares	40.00
1941 shares	120.00

Mr. TAJIRI's "growing account" at the Pacific Co-operative Union showed a debit of \$225.04, plus a fertilizer account of \$152.75. Against this account was paid from TAJIRI's account (File 4419) the sum of \$93.22, being the acknowledged portion of the account. The Pacific Co-operative Union under their by-laws, reserve the right to cancel any share interest that a grower might have against any debt incurred by him, and therefore, the Pacific Co-operative Union have cancelled all the redeemable share interest registered in the wife's name, in settlement of the unpaid portion of the account, leaving a balance of \$7.57, which will become redeemable early in 1947.

Interest on Pacific Co-operative Union shares totalling \$9.28 has been received at this office and credited to the wife's account from time to time. The above Japanese was also the registered holder of a \$10.00 United Farmers Co-operative Exchange share. This share was sold by the Custodian for the sum of \$65.00, which when received was credited to the account here, together with \$2.40 interest on same. The share certificate has been forwarded to this office.

LIABILITY SUMMARY

Juro TAJIRI declared he had no liabilities when he registered with this office on the 17th April, 1942, but the following claims were filed against him, and acknowledged by him as correct and were paid in full from his account at this office:-

The Pacific Co-operative Union filed a claim of \$477.79 covering

Land Taxes paid on TAJIRI's behalf	\$88.55
N.G. Electric light bill " "	4.67
Truck repairs	231.82
Fertilizer	152.75

The first two were refunded to the Pacific Co-op. Union on the 26th Feb. and 8th March, 1943, respectively.

The two latter claims were disputed by TAJIRI and there is considerable correspondence on file regarding these. Agreements were verbal and recollections of both parties were diametrically opposed, and the Custodian finally advised the P.C.U. and TAJIRI 23rd July, 1943 and 4th Sept 1943, that the Custodian could do nothing further in the matter.

However, the P.C.U. under their by-laws reserves the right to cancel any share interest that a grower may have against any debt incurred by him, and they therefore cancelled all redeemable share interest registered in TAJIRI's wife's name (File 4423) until these two disputed amounts were paid up.

There was a claim of \$315.00 filed against Kasuaki TAJIRI (the above named son) by Minoji MURAI. On the 8th March, 1944, MURAI wrote asking collection of this amount from Juro TAJIRI. On the 9th April, Kasuaki wrote to this office authorizing payment of the account from his father's credit at this office and the balance from his own. This letter was also signed by Juro TAJIRI. Payment of Juro's balance of \$284.23, was transferred to MURAI 17th April, 1944, and the balance of \$30.77 was paid from Kasuaki's account 13th June, 1944 (File No. 4531)

This file reveals no other liabilities.

Dear Madam:

We received your letter of the 29th May, and acknowledge receipt of your United Farmers and Pacific Co-operative Union share certificates.

According to the records of the Pacific Co-operative Union, shares were registered in your name from operations of your husband. This share interest amounted to \$670.00 in non-redeemable shares and \$390.00 in redeemable shares. Your husband had a debit balance at the Pacific Co-operative Union in the amount of \$325.04, plus a fertilizer account amounting to \$152.75. Mr. TAJIRI disputed owing the majority of this claim. However this office paid from his account the sum of \$93.22, being the acknowledged portion. Under the by-laws of the Co-operative, they have the authority to cancel any Grower's shares against any indebtedness he might have to the Co-operative, and this they have done in your case. They have cancelled your redeemable shares except for the sum of \$7.00, being a portion of your 1941 shares, which will become redeemable early next year, at which time this balance together with any other funds received at this office, will be forwarded to you.

Interest on your Pacific Co-operative Union shares amounting to \$9.28 has been received at this office from time to time, and has been credited to your account here.

You were also the holder of a \$10.00 United Farmers Co-operative Exchange share. This share has been sold by the Custodian for \$65.00, and this sum together with interest on same amounting to \$2.40, has also been credited to you.

Attached hereto please find Custodian cheque in the amount of \$76.68 being your full credit balance at this office derived from the sale of the above mentioned United Farmers share and interest on shares. Any additional funds that are received here will be forwarded to you.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the Protected Area which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this and acknowledge the cheque, we are enclosing a stamped addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
