PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

July 26, 1946.

Re: Maki (Mrs. Asai) OGAKI, #06139

& This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 21, 1942. She was evacuated on September 12, 1942.

In her declaration she reported 10 pieces of effects left at Cumberland, B.C. These were all shipped to her in May, July and October, 1942 with the exception of a bed stored at the Cumberland Storage and furniture and fixtures left in the house formerly occupied by this woman. These included a kitchen cabinet, kitchen table and chairs, a bed spring and miscellaneous kitchenware. Matt Brown informed us verbally while in our office on July 18, 1946 that the kitchen table and benches and kitchenware had been discarded. The bed, kitchen cabinet and bed spring were sold at auction in Cumberland and the net proceeds of \$10.36 were credited to the account of this woman. This is being remitted to her today.

A notation on this file states that a Mr. J. Walker, 1020 W. 20th Ave., Vancouver is holding a home-made radio with parts belonging to this woman. We are today writing Mr. Walker to ascertain if he still holds this radio. *This letter was returned "No such address"*

She reported \$300.00 in Victory Bonds in her own possession and \$95.00 in War Savings Certificates in her own possession. These did not come under the control of this office.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

The above numbered policy written in your name and covering to the extent of \$400.00 on household furniture and personal effects, while contained in a dwelling situate on District Lot 27, and being No. 5 Japtown, near the City of Cumberland, expires on December 17th next.

According to the information appearing on your wife's file No. 4561, it would seem that the few things still remaining there in the care of J. C. Williams, the present tenant, have such a small value that it would not be worth carrying fire insurance to protect them.

Under the above circumstances, we are allowing this policy to lapse unless we receive word from you that you do wish fire insurance carried and are prepared to remit the amount of whatever premium is necessary.
