

After our previous correspondence with you in 1942
we began making arrangements with the B. C. Packers (A, A, c.)
for the rental of your equipment but their plans
changed and the idea was let drop.

We have recently, as you know, been engaged in liquidating the effects of evacuees and the manager of the Phoenix Cannery recently showed interest in your boat-building equipment. We, therefore, had it appraised by a competent and independent machinery firm in Vancouver and sold it to the Phoenix Cannery for the sum of \$715.60. This sum has now been received and placed to the credit of your account.

This price is somewhat less than that set by you in your declaration of April 21st, 1942, but in excess of the previous offer of \$685.00 which we referred to you on October 22nd, 1942. We should mention, however, that in the meantime despite efforts on the part of the Phoenix Cannery to prevent persons entering the building, a certain amount of smaller items had evidently been removed by thieves. Unfortunately, we had no detailed inventory of the smaller items and so are unable to say what was taken. Also there are some personal effects and nets which we are disposing of.

For your information I wrote to K. Kishi on April 20th lest as follows:

"With regard to the radios. Several months ago I gave the Custodian at Steveston the Battery set and the Portable set with a request that they be shipped to you and I am surprised that you have not received them. You should communicate with the Custodian at Steveston and enquire about them. It will be necessary for me to keep the other one for a while yet until I am able to find one to take it's place.

I wish to bring to your attention the fact that you voluntarily left these radios with me for the duration of the war and I at no time asked you for them. I am carying out my part of the arrangement and I expect you to carry out yours. While I do not feel obligated to return the third radio to you until the end of the war, I am quite prepared to do so when I am able to obtain one to take it's place."

The 2 radios referred to were delivered to the Custodian at Steveston on September 11th 1944 and I have a receipt for them.

I feel that I am not being unreasonable in this matter and I don't know that there is anything more I can say at this time.


