PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

Rei Shinsu MATSUNAGA, Reg. No. 06968

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 21, 1942. He was evacuated on August 25, 1942.

In his declaration he reported 24 articles of household effects left in care of Matt Brown, at Cumberland. Of these items Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 10, 11, 13, 18 (8 pieces) were shipped to him on August 23, 1942. On October 23, 1942, Mr. Brown sent us a list of the items on hand. This list showed the items listed on the Chattel Summary. All of these items appear to have been sold with the exception of the old bed and spring, and these were undoubtedly discarded as unsaleable. The net proceeds from the sale of goods sold for this man amounted to \$99.52, which has been credited to his account.

A radio said to have been surrendered by this man was sold at auction for the net sum of \$31.67, which has been credited to his account, but is held for production of the radio receipt.

The motor car V-17, surrendered by this man, was sold for the net sum of \$286.11, which was credited to his account. This money was remitted to him on April 20, 1943, May 14, 1943, June 19, 1943, July 20, 1943, leaving \$36.11 in his account and this together with the tax refund of \$13.02 was remitted to him on September 2, 1943.

The sum of \$13.02 was received from the Income Tax Department as refund of National Defence Tax for 1943. This was credited to his account and remitted as reported in the preceding paragraph.

MATSUNAGA declared a house built on land owned by Canadian Collieries (Munsmuir) Ltd. The sum of \$10.00 was paid in to his account as salvage value of this building. This money was remitted to him on November 5, 1943.

This man reported \$100.00 Victory Bond and \$35.00 in War Savings Certificates in his own possession. These did not come under the control of this office.

MATSUNAGA declared a building on land owned by the Deep Bay Digging Company. No funds have been paid to his account from this source.

This file reveals no other property.

Dear Sir:

In reply to your inquiry regarding your radio and bedroom suite, we regret to inform you that we are unable to comply with your request for shipment of these articles, together with all other saleable chattels identified as your property, have been sold.

The radio surrendered by you was sold for the net sum of \$31.67. This sum will be released to your open credit if you will send us the receipt given to you at the time the radio was surrendered.

The net proceeds from the sale of your other chattels was \$99.52, which has been credited to your account.

You have already received the \$286.41 from the sale of your motor-car.

The sum of \$13.02 received as Refund of National Defense Tax was sent to you on September 2, 1943.

On November 5, 1943, we remitted to you the sum of \$10.00 received from Canadian Collieries (Dumfries) Ltd. as salvage value of the building which you had built on land owned by that company.

We note that you are planning to move to Eastern Canada. While requests for remittances to persons living in housing areas under the control of the Department of Labour are referred to that Department for their recommendations before the funds are remitted, this is not being done in the case of persons living outside the housing areas.

It would appear that we have accounted for all the property of every kind left by you in the protected area, which vested in the Custodian, and in order that you may confirm this, and send us the radio receipt, we enclose a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.
