living outside Canada.

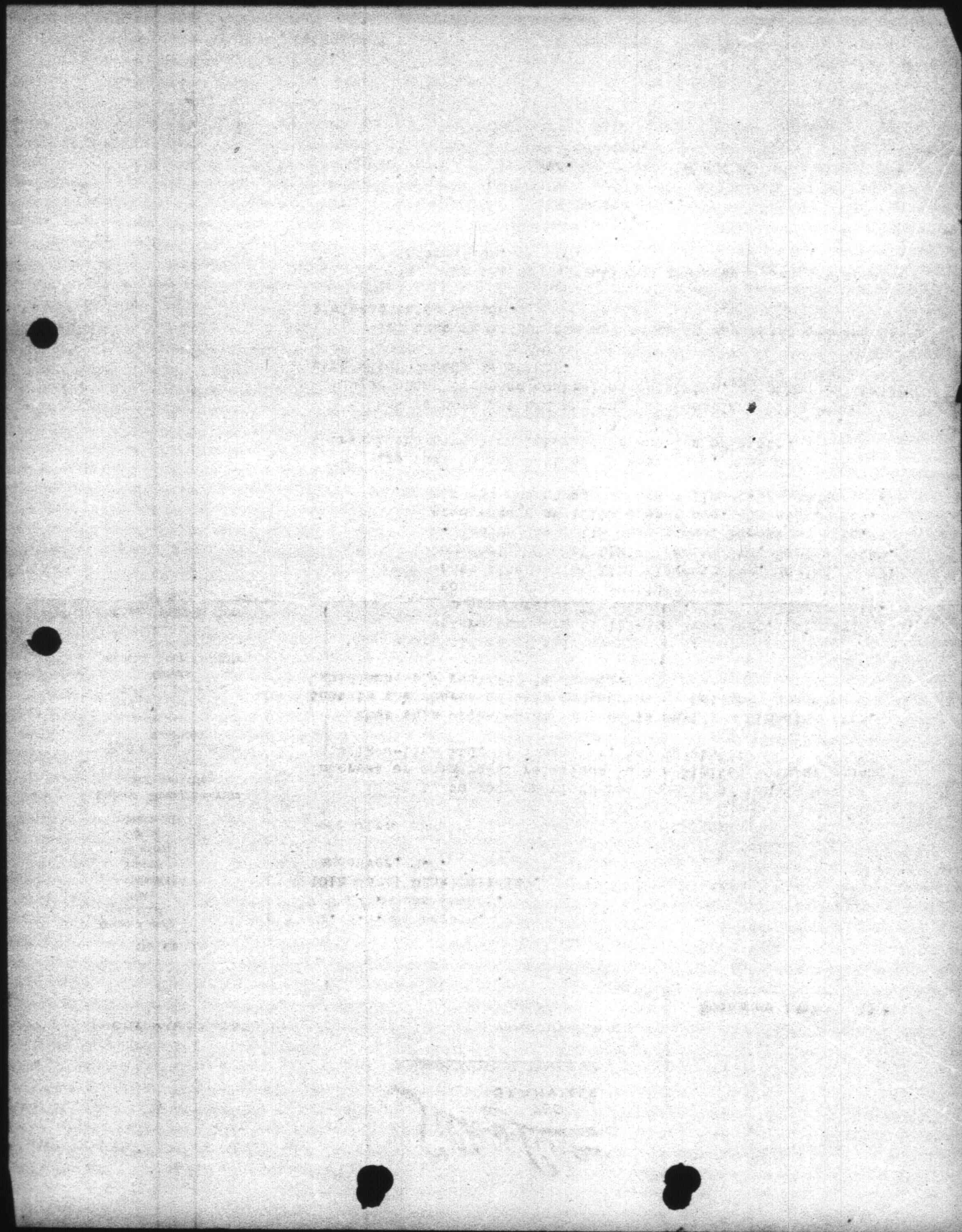
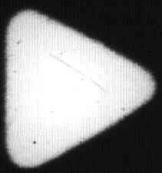
