CHATELS:

The above, who made her declaration to the Custodian on April 20/42 and was evacuated on Sept. 8/42, declared chattels as listed on the Chattel Schedule on file, at 209 #3 Rd., Eburne, B.C. This house belonged to Mr. Noburo DOMAI and the goods of Mr. DOMAI and the above were inventoried at the same time by Custodian agent Mr. G.M. Harris on Oct. 20/44. on List 4718, the original of which is one of the *pl* of Mr. Noburo DOMAI.

Mrs. OSAKA in her letter to us dated July 30/46 stated that she had taken her Singer sewing machine and vanity dresser with her when she was evacuated. The other chattels declared by her were sold as shown on the Chattel Schedule on file for the net sum of \$62.06 and this sum credited to the account of the above. This is her entire credit balance with the Custodian.

The file reveals the above owned no specified articles.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.

During the time of the Japanese evacuation, I had to leave my home and moved to Hastings Park. We did so under certain conditions, that is, we were allowed to have only 150 lbs. of baggage and the rest had to be stored. We did this, and stored our belongings which we could not take with us at Eburne B.C.

● The belongings included - a bureau with a mirror, and a bed set with ^a spring and a pair of rails.

I would like to know if you could have these articles sent to me. They are stored ~~at~~ in care of Mr. Paul Kales, Eburne, P.O., Eburne, B.C. If so, could you please let me know as soon as possible.

We did find most of the goods you declared at 209 No. 1 Road, Eburne. Would this be the address of Mr. Paul Kalek at that time? Your prompt reply will be appreciated.

We did not find the electric Singer sewing machine, vanity dressing table, bed set, heater stove and some other articles you declared in your registration form on April 20th, 1942. Will you please let us know if you took these things with you when you were evacuated or otherwise disposed of them.
