Three claims appeared on this file against the above

As Tsutomu URA had no assets with which to pay these claims we wrote to the Japanese and his wife on the 11th December, 1944, asking for acknowledgment, and if correct that payment should be made from Mrs. Ura's account. Mrs. Ura denied these accounts saying that the first two were against her husband's Company, which had gone bankrupt some 15 years ago, and for which she was not liable, and stated the the latter claim had been paid. The creditors were notified in December, 1944, and no further action has been taken.

The B.C. Electric Railway Co. sent in to this office 65¢ in July, 1945, being a refund of security deposit.

This file reveals no other assets or liabilities.

In reply to your letter of December 11,
(File No. ⁴⁸⁴²⁹~~4777~~) Mrs. Ura claims she has no
outstanding debts to be paid.

The debts of St. Pauls Hospital, Maple
Ridge Bakery and Clappison Bros have been paid
through the Maple Ridge Co-operative, as Mrs.
Ura has credit balances in their hands from the pro-
fit through her shipments of strawberries and rasp-
berries. These payments have been settled between
agreements with the manager of the Co-operative,
Mr. R. Yoshida now of Ashme, B.C., and Mrs.
Ura. Those of R. Tagashira & Co. and M.
Furuya Co. are debts belonging to the company


