Re: Mr. Denichiro KITAGAWA

A letter we have today received from your brother, Denichiro Kitagawa, Police Registration No. 13772 of New Denver, B. C., indicates that he has been sending letters to you but has failed to receive any reply from you in connection with the property registered in your name which you sold through Mr. Hal Kessies of Ranczy for the sum of \$300.00. Mr. Denichiro Kitagawa states that although the land was registered in your name in fact you had no interest in the land and that the land was purchased by you with funds loaned to you by your brother, Denichiro Kitagawa.

We previously suggested to Mr. Denichiro Kitagawa that as this appeared to be purely a family matter it should be possible for your brother and you to make any necessary adjustments by means of direct negotiation.

Your credit balance with the Custodian at this time amounts to roughly \$90.00. We assume that it was in order for us to transfer your present credit balance of \$92.00 from your account to the account of your brother, Denichiro Kitagawa, and ask for your confirmation without fail by return mail. One reason your brother requires the use of funds is to enable him to pay to Dr. G. Morse and to Dr. J. F. Sparling amounts owing to them by Denichiro Kitagawa.

Please without fail reply to this communication on the same day you receive it. Any delay in receiving a reply from you will necessitate our getting in touch with the local Supervisor in Alberta of the B. C. Security Commission.

Dear Sir:

Thank you for your letter dated July 5th. Our records indicate that insofar as your brother, Kozo Kitagawa, Police Registration No. 10617, is concerned, property registered in his name was sold by him through Mr. Hal Mensies of Hancy for the sum of \$300.00. Your wife, Iku Kitagawa, indicated, according to a letter we received from Mr. Hal Mensies early in July, 1942, that she desired some funds but as the land was in the name of your brother, Mr. Kozo Kitagawa, we wrote to him on July 10, 1942 and acquainted him with your wife's and your wishes. In reply, your brother, Kozo Kitagawa, did not agree and requested that the \$300.00 in question be sent not to Iku Kitagawa but to himself, and the Custodian's office has complied with the request of Mr. Kozo Kitagawa to the extent of sending him certain funds and paying certain claims for him with the result that his remaining credit balance with the Custodian stands at \$92.98 only as of today's date.

Your letter under reply now indicates that although the land may have been registered in the name of your brother (and our search of the records indicates that it was registered in his name) in fact he had no interest in the land and that you had loaned him the money originally for buying the land which he sold.

Under the circumstances we can only suggest that you communicate direct with your brother, Kozo Kitagawa, in care of Mr. A. E. Russell, D. C. Security Commission, Lethbridge, Alberta, and it should be possible for you to make any necessary adjustment by direct negotiation between you and your brother.

If your brother agrees, please ask him to authorize our withdrawing \$26.00 from his account to be transferred by the Custodian to your account which in turn will enable the Custodian to pay to Dr. G. Morse and to Dr. J. P. Sparling sums owed by you to the doctors in question.

MEMORANDUM

From Mr. I. McPherson

It appears that there are two registrants of the name of Kozo Kitagawa.

One (File 1380, Police Registration No. 04410) is a storekeeper at Steveston who made declaration on April 20th, the other, (File 4780, Police Registration No. 10617) a mill-hand, residing with his brother Denichiro Kitagawa, 17th Ave., Haney, also made declaration on April 20th that he owned no real property. The signatures are somewhat alike, but are believed to be by different parties.

Mr. Richardson discovered that a parcel of land near Haney was owned by a Kozo Kitagawa, who appears on the Assessment Roll of the Municipality of Maple Ridge. A search at the Registry office disclosed that he has title to the parcel described in "Confirmation of Ownership," and the Vesting Order covering this parcel was submitted to you on the supposition that the evidence of ownership was sufficient, and in any case advisable.
