repairs ordered by Sasaki)

The balance of \$20.00 was paid to the Custodian on
June 2, 1943.

This motorcycle was at Motorcycle Sales Ltd. where it
had been sent for repair. A cheque for \$23.00 from
Sasaki was in the hands of Motorcycle Sales Ltd. As
this cheque was not cashed the Custodian allowed the
company to deduct this sum from the purchase price.

Motorcycle Sales Ltd. asked for \$5.00 for a year's
storage, but there is nothing to show that this was
allowed. The receipt on file is for \$20.00.

According to the ledger, costs of \$4.72 were charged
against the account. The 72 cents was for advertising,
which would appear to be in order. There is nothing
on file to show what the \$4.00 covers. *appraisal fee.*

There is nothing to show that Motorcycle Sales Ltd.
had returned the cheque for \$23.00 which they were
holding.

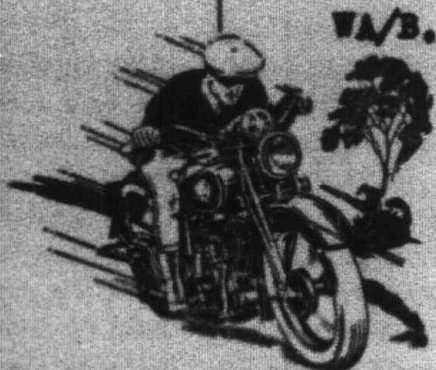

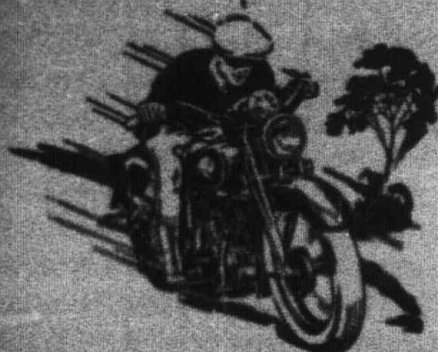
