We wish to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 15th inst. relative to the three claims submitted to you in ours of the 28th October last.

No. 1. \$5.00 - Vancouver General Hospital

This you deny, but on contacting the Hospital by telephone we find that the amount is still unpaid. The original bill was for \$7.00, on which the Hospital reports that you paid \$2.00, reducing the amount to the \$5.00 now claimed. We are enclosing herewith copy of the Hospital account taken from our file for your further information. As this claim seems to be correct we shall be obliged if you will forward a remittance to this office in settlement of same.

No. 2. \$5.50 - Naosuke AIHOSHI

We are reporting to AIHOSHI what you say regarding his claim, and are leaving the matter for you and him to adjust. His address is:

No. 3. \$220.00 - Teichiro ASAOKA

We have reported to ASAOKA what you say and have asked him for his immediate reply. You claim that the account was settled in 1939, but he declares it as still owing as late as July 1942, when he filed a declaration with the Custodian. We shall advise you in regard to this when we hear from him.

Dear Sir,

Received on Friday May 12th the letter which you mailed on April 29th. Very sorry for the delay.

On a letter, dated October 28th, 1943 from the Custodian we received the same problem, but we sent the answer back but I can't understand them not receiving it.

The follows are the details concerning the matters

Firstly. The General Hospital - When my youngest son now 7 years of age was 2, through an accident was interned in the General Hospital but we definitely paid the money up, and since then nobody in my family has been in the hospital.

Secondly - The \$5.50 of Mr Aihoshi was for a pair of trousers which were too small, so when we were evacuated I mailed it back but if he says he did not receive it and claims the money I guess it means that I have to settle it although I am positive I sent it back.

Lastly - The amount of \$220.00 of Mr Asacka is really \$267.00. This business was on strictly business and in November 27th 1939 in the Vancouver Court House, under the registration number of 49418 it was settled.

For further details, if they look into it at the Court House or at Williams Manson & Roe-Lawyer 716 Hall Building, Vancouver, B. C. I think they could get the detail information.

Since we did not receive any answer on this matter last time, I am writing another letter following this letter and forwarding it into the Custodian.

Dr Williams, Dentist, who did dentistry work on my daughter said that he has not yet received the money for the work he did and wanted me to send into you the enclosed sealed envelope.
