PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

CHATELS:

In his declaration of April 17, 1942, the above Japanese declared:

1 trunk	1 box carpenter's tools
1 baby bed	1 clock
1 dresser and mirror	dishes
1 baby chair	baby toys
1 baby carriage	1 electric lamp

On this JP Form he states the total value of the goods to be \$290.00. KOBAYASHI declared he would leave these goods at House #39, Imperial Cannery, Steveston, B.C., the home of his wife's parents. Tetsuo ODA, File No. 4868, Mrs. KOBAYASHI's brother, stated on his JP form that the key to this house would be given to the Custodian. A Memorandum dated Dec. 13, 1944, from Mr. Mackenzie to File states that a box of tools belonging to R.M. KOBAYASHI was listed on chattel list #38, taken from Phoenix Cannery House #9, the home of Kay ODA, File 14561, who is a sister of Mrs. KOBAYASHI's. This box of tools was sold at public auction on Feb. 24, 1944, and the sale resulted in net proceeds of \$2.28, which were credited to Mutsumi Richard KOBAYASHI's account in this office.

No record has been found of the rest of the chattels, but a Memorandum dated Jan. 3, 1945, from Mr. Kitchener, of the Imperial Cannery, to Mr. Harris reports that R.M. KOBAYASHI and Tetsuo ODA, File No. 4868, sold the effects from House #39, Imperial Cannery to junk men, and that the house had since been demolished. There are no requests on file from KOBAYASHI for information concerning his chattels.

File 3000 - OSA, Tania (Mrs. Kuznetsov), Bulgaria - In a letter to Mr. Tom King dated November 23/43 referred to in memo of Nov 27/43 from C.C.I., requested shipment of a forcing uniform. There is nothing on file to indicate shipment was made.

In a Custodian release dated Nov 8/43 she requested shipment to her son, Arthur, in Toronto dinner ware stored with Mr. Tom King. There is nothing on file to indicate shipment was made.

File 4070 - KISHINEV, Hanna (Mrs. Kuznetsov), Rumania - writes on Nov 17/43 to have a box of dinner ware, used by her mother (Tania OSA, 3000) and stored with Mr. Tom King, shipped to her sister Kay OSA (14561) now Mrs. Elizabeth YAKUB, in Toronto in care of Arthur OSA, brother.

This is the dinner ware requested on Custodian release Nov 8/43 on File 3000.

File 14561 - YAKUB, Elizabeth (Mrs. King), now Kay OSA, Rumania states in a letter of July 10/43 that she left no effects in British Columbia, yet we have goods stored in her name (Kay OSA) at warehouse #3 basement - moved from the Phoenix Cannery house #9, on June 24/44.

On the same chattels list (430) is listed a box of tools belonging to R. H. KIM-YACHI (file 4006), brother-in-law - who declared on his "JP" form, chattels left at house #99, Imperial Cannery with the goods of Tania OSA (file 4000) she declares chattels which we are now trying to locate as his file does not disclose where or when they were moved.

We are in receipt of your letter of September 19, 1947 enclosing a cheque in the amount of \$15.00 in part payment of the claim lodged against you by T. Maikawa Stores, Ltd. We enclose herewith Custodian receipt for this cheque.

You ask in your letter for information of your chattels which you state were worth at least \$500.00, yet in your JP Form of April 17, 1942, you declared these chattels to have a total value of \$290.00. When investigating the position of your chattels after your evacuation from the Protected Area, Mr. Kitchener of the Imperial Cannery reported to our agent that the effects from House #39 Imperial Cannery were sold by your brother-in-law and yourself to Junk men, and that the house was later demolished. Would you please send any remarks you wish to make to this office immediately.
