A claim was filed against Masaki KAWASHIMA on April 26/44 by the Provincial Board of Health, F.B. Unit, for hospitalization of his daughter, Fumiko. The amount of the claim was \$348.00. The B.C.S.C. paid \$336.40 to the Provincial Board of Health. According to Mr. Dusenbury's note on claim sheet, he was advised by the office of Institutional Revenue, that the claim was settled in full for this amount. The file does not indicate why this payment was made by the B.C.S.C.

There are no other claims on file against KAWASHIMA.

This file reveals that KAWASHIMA owned no real property in any protected area of B.C. and did not carry any Fire Insurance.

CHATELS: Mr. and Mrs. KAWASHIMA declared chattels as shown on Chattel Schedule on file at 130 W. 4th Ave. Chattels removed from this address and identified as belonging to them were sold at auction for the net sum of \$51.78 and this sum credited to a joint account in their names. Full details are given on Chattel Schedule and summary on file.

MONEYS RECEIVABLE: KAWASHIMA declared the sum of \$598.00 owing to him by Mr. Katsuki KADOWAKI. Mr. Bell wrote to Mr. KADOWAKI regarding this claim on June 19/46, but KADOWAKI has not replied to this letter. In his declaration KAWASHIMA states he is endeavouring to collect the balance. It will however be necessary to tell KAWASHIMA that we have been unable to collect any portion of this claim.

No property interests other than those mentioned above are found on this file.

It is noted the linoleum and the suitcases inventoried by the Custodian are missing. The balance of the goods inventoried were sold at auction for the net sum of \$51.78 and this sum credited to the joint account of Mr. and Mrs. KAWASHIMA.

We are in receipt of your letter of the 9th instant, requesting the remittance of \$50.25 from your account with this office.

The balance standing at your credit is \$122.98, as per statement sent you on the 25th of September, 1945, but, as explained to you at that time, this balance is not free because your file shows a claim of \$598.00 registered against you by Masaki KAWASHIMA (File 4885).

In your letter of the 16th of February, you stated that you were taking up the question of this claim direct with Masaki KAWASHIMA and if you can arrange with him to send us a letter withdrawing his claim, for direct settlement between you, or any other reason, we shall be glad to write it off and free your balance.


Dear Madam:
