In his JP statement of April 18, 1942 Mr. OHORI declared owning the above described property, which was his residence until he and his family were evacuated. On April 27, 1942 the owner leased this pro erty to George Villeneuve for the consideration of \$100.00 for the period of April 27, 1942 to April 27, 1943 together with the taxes for the year 1942. In subsequent years of occupancy the Lessee was to pay the taxes and to receive the crop. Copy of lease on file.

Due to ill health of the Lessee, this lease was cancelled on Oct. 14, 1942 and a new lease made by the Secretary of State with Mr. J.B. Boux for the period of one year, Oct. 15, 1942 to October 14, 1943,

at the rental of \$15.00 per month. Further terms of the Lease permitted the use of sundry chattles by the lessee and preserved certain spaces on the premises for the storing of chattels and effect which were the property of the Lessor. Terms of lease were fully discharged until the property was sold. On April 4th the sale of the property was made to the Director of Vetarans' Land Act in the sum of \$1958.00, which was the value set by the Soldier Settlement Board. Acknowledgement of receipt of Duplicate Certificate of Title No. 169002 E is on file under date April 4,1944. On May 10, 1944 Mrs. OHORI was advised of this sale and that the proceeds had been placed to his credit. Mr. OHORI's objection to the sale of his property is found in his letter to us of Nov. 6, 1945 from which we quote " As I understand that our house and property was sold sometime ago, I cannot figure why it was sold a such a low price. Some of the farmers whom had a smaller farm compared to mine were sold at a higher price. I figure that this was unfair." We quote also from his letter of June 3, 1946 "My property was sold for approximately \$1900.00. Now here is Sec. 30, T2, L3, I believe property of Mr. Masoyuki KANAI which was sold for \$4000.00. He had only 62 acres with 3 acres cleared, about 260' x 20' single deck chicken house, etc., I had a more useful, advantageable property than what he owned, and more buildings too. Then why was Mr. K's property sold two times a higher price than mine?"





CLAIM NO. 852 - Masato OHORI This claim is made in respect of a 7.65 acre parcel of land situate near Kennedy Station, which had been developed by the claiment for chicken and egg production. There was erected on the property a dwelling 10 years old, with garage, 5 chicken houses and a feed house. The appraisal made by the S. 3.B. Appraiser of the 2 double chicken houses does not appear to take into account the fact that these were 2 storey structures. Applying the principle adopted in the Otsuki case Claim No. 1013, I sonsider that an additional allowence should have been made by the Appraiser of \$675.00 in respect of these 3 chicken houses. In the result, the sele price of this property should be shewn as \$2633.00 instead of \$1958.00, for the purpose of applying the over-all, which, in the case of properties in the Municipality of Surrey, will result in an addition of approximately 90 per cent. of the sale price, which would mean an estimate of fair market value in this instance of \$5000.00. I THEREFORE RECOMMEND payment to the claimant of \$3042.00, being the difference between the estimated fair market value of \$5000.00 and the price realized by him on the sale, namely,- \$1958.00. In this instance a claim was made in respect of an electric pump installed by the claimant, for which no value appears to have been allowed by the S.S.B. Appraiser.
