

Claimants stated that they had no chattels and none were declared on their J.P. Forms.

- (a) Goods value \$75. Sold by Tender for \$12.
- (b) " * \$425. No record at any time. \$500.

Claimants left their chattels in a barn which they stated was locked. The tenant agreed in his lease with claimant to be responsible to him for the implements left with him.

Y. & N. YAMAMOTO Case No. 485

> Mr. G. M. Harris was instructed by Custodian to find out what could be done about bringing the goods to the auction room but the only chattels recovered belonging to claimants were Set of Harness and one pile Bean Poles.

The harness which belonged to their father was sold by Auction for \$10.50 and he was credited with proceeds.

An offer of \$12. was received for the Bean Poles which was accepted in order to avoid possible theft.

There is no claim for the Plough and Disc as these belonged to their father and he received credit for these, and the horse belonging to claimant was found to be diseased and was ordered to be destroyed by G.G. McDonald, Veterinary Surgeon.

It is submitted that the chattels, not having been declared until lst April 1943, were not found by reason of the erroneous statement of claimants and accordingly no claim should be entertained in that event.

A letter was produced at the Custodian's office from Mr. Augustus by Mr. Robinson offering to buy a pile of bean sticks, etc., but there is no record of this letter having been left at Custodian's office. Name of Claimant
