As H. Uniteduced claimed the above amount, namely \$616.00, as representing Principal due under an Agreement of Sale unde between himself as Vendor and the above Bracuse as surchaser for the real property most as 1975 t. Let Avenue. The City Later took possession of this property for arreads of taxes, and subsequently a brother of this bracuse repurchased the property under a fac fale from the City and later sold it to a Black. In our letter of July 27, 1023 to gr. Shitcheed we salviced him of the addresses of Kasusoto Phillip Edbardshift and Tomogra Edbardship, father, that he might contact thes direct in the above matter. So further action was taken by the Quetodies.

The claims by the Constal Truck Sales and Freeman & Brosnan for \$149.07 and \$15.50, respectively, more lodged with the Custodian in the fall of 1942. We made to the above Bracuse regarding these claims on August 12th, 1943 and again on October Lat, 1943, but sid not receive buy reply. Therefore, on Horamber 17th, 1943 we advised the above-mentioned cruditors that we had written to Mr. Kobayashi but that he had not replied and at that time gave then the Bracuse's address that they might write to his direct in in effort to collect the amounts owing. He educed them that he had no assets or any kind with the Custodian and no further action would be taken by this office.

Claims accordingly closed.

No other claims against the above Japanese person are revealed on this file.

Sheet states this man owned two trucks, no vehicles owned by this man were surrendered to the R.C.M.P. and no vehicles of any kind were declared on his form J card. It also states that it would appear, therefore, that any motor vehicles the above Evacuee may have owned were disposed of before he registered with the Custodian. NO OTHER PROPERTY OF ANY KIND WHATSOEVER BELONGING TO THE ABOVE JAPANESE PERSON IS REVEALED ON THIS FILE.

On August 18th-1937 an Agreement of Sale was made between this writer as Vendor and Phillip K. Kobayashi as purchaser for a property described as lying and being in the City of Vancouver known as Lot 14, Block 206, Sub-Division 526, Postal address 1935 West 1st Ave. Vancouver B.C.

A clause in the said Agreement called for the purchaser to pay to the City of Vancouver arresrs of Taxes totaling Three hundred and twenty five dollars (\$325.00) in the Citys Consolidation Scheme.

This was not lived up to.

The City took possession.

This Pillip K. Kobayashi together with his parents his brothers and his sisters continued in possession for a while as tenants paying as such to the City of Vancouver direct, till:-

A brother of the said Phillip K. Kobayashi repurchased the Property under a Tax sale from the City, the Kobayashi family continued in possession till:-
