The following claims are revealed on file against the above Japanese person:

E. H. Whitehead	\$616.00
General Truck Sales	\$149.87
Jack Ford (Freeman & Freeman)	\$ 15.50


E. H. Whitehead claimed the above amount, namely \$616.00, as representing Principal due under an Agreement of Sale made between himself as Vendor and the above Evacuee as purchaser for the real property known as 1935 W. 1st Avenue. The City later took possession of this property for arrears of taxes, and subsequently a brother of this Evacuee repurchased the property under a Tax Sale from the City and later sold it to a Hindu. In our letter of July 27, 1943 to Mr. Whitehead we advised him of the addresses of Kasumoto Phillip KOBAYASHI and Tomoaki KOBAYASHI, father, that he might contact them direct in the above matter. No further action was taken by the Custodian.

The claims by the General Truck Sales and Freeman & Freeman for \$149.87 and \$15.50, respectively, were lodged with the Custodian in the Fall of 1942. We wrote to the above Evacuee regarding these claims on August 12th, 1943 and again on October 1st, 1943, but did not receive any reply. Therefore, on November 17th, 1943 we advised the above-mentioned creditors that we had written to Mr. Kobayashi but that he had not replied and at that time gave them the Evacuee's address that they might write to him direct in an effort to collect the amounts owing. We advised them that he had no assets of any kind with the Custodian and no further action would be taken by this office.

Claims accordingly closed.

No other claims against the above Japanese person are revealed on this file.

Under date of May 7th, 1942 the above Japanese person signed our Form J card certifying that he had no property of any kind whatsoever in any protected area in British Columbia.

On December 19, 1944, there appears on file a memorandum stating that although the information on the R.C.M.P. Sheet states this man owned two trucks, no vehicles owned by this man were surrendered to the R.C.M.P. and no vehicles of any kind were declared on his Form J card. It also states that it would appear, therefore, that any motor vehicles the above Evacuee may have owned were disposed of before he registered with the Custodian. In reply we would advise that we have no record of anyone by the name of "P. Kobayashi". Our records show many "Kobayashi's", but "P" is an initial we have not come across in dealing with Japanese names, and we think probably this is an error.

As it seems probable that General Truck Sales would, at least, have the full name of the person to whom the truck was sold, we would ask you to give us this information. Also details of the sale to Kobayashi, such as date of sale, residence of purchaser at time of purchase, etc.

When this information is received, we will be in a position to advise you if there is anything we can do to assist you in this matter.



I desire to collect, claim on monies or chattles of one Phillip K. Kobayashi for the sum of Five hundred and forty two dollars and eighty cents (#542.80) being Four hundred and sixty dollars (#460.00) principal and balance interest as per agreement for a sale of Land (lot 14 -Bk. 200 - Sub. Div. 528 - Grup I - New Westminster District.

as follows:-

While Kobayashi the father negotiated this deal his son Phillip K. Kobayashi signed the agreement and I recieved a cash down payment (#175.00) and for several months instalments of \$25.00 both in accord with the agreement, but he not only failed to continue the instalments till the sum total was paid but also failed to pay to the City of Vancouver \$139.54 a down payment for tax arrears under the citys consolidation Scheme same called for in the agreement with the result the property reverted to the City, the Kobayashi/s next bought the property from the City this time another brother signing the agreement with the city and paying a down payment of \$125.00 with a lower instalment claus in that agreement.

Phillip Kobayashi together with Kobayashi senior, his brother and the whole Kobayashi family have continued to live on the property since they became purchasers under my agreement of sale and imxine while I with my family of five British subjects all had been as a consequence forced to accept Relief from the same City of Vancouver till recently.

On August 18th-1937 an Agreement of Sale was made between this writer as Vendor and Phillip K. Kobayashi as purchaser for a property described as lying and being in the City of Vancouver known as Lot 14, Block 206, Sub-Division 526, Postal address 1935 West 1st Ave. Vancouver B.C.

A clause in the said Agreement called for the purchaser to pay to the City of Vancouver arrears of Taxes totaling Three hundred and twenty five dollars (\$325.00) in the Citys Consolidation Scheme.

This was not lived up to.

The City took possession.

This Phillip K. Kobayashi together with his parents his brothers and his sisters continued in possession for a while as tenants paying as such to the City of Vancouver direct, till:-

A brother of the said Phillip K. Kobayashi repurchased the Property under a Tax sale from the City, the Kobayashi family continued in possession till:-

This brother in question resold the Property to an outside party (Hindu) prior to evacuation by your Office.

I beg to make a claim the sum of Six Hundred and sixteen dollars (616.00) being Principal and interest as per the Agreement to January 1943 due and owing.
