JAPANESE VETERANS CAST BALLOTS AT HOPE
(Special to the Daily Province)

HOPE, June 12 - Two Japanese from Tashme evacuation camp cast their votes here in Monday's federal election.

They were Saburo Sato and Sechi Kinoshita, who produced documents to show they were honourably discharged veterans of Canada's armed forces in Frist World War.

They were permitted to vote after taking the oath of allegiance.
