MEMO: To Mr. Green.

RE: Frank SHIRAISHI

Mr. Russel R. Kennington came into the office the other day and stated that he had paid Frank Shiraishi \$50.00 for a 1931 Plymouth Roadster. He left with me a cancelled cheque in that amount and showed me motor vehicle transfers signed by Mr. Shiraishi. Mr. Kennington had applied to the Motor Vehicle Branch for a licence, but, naturally, had been referred to this office as the transfer was not executed by the Custodian.

As the car in question had never been seized by the R.C.M.P. it would come under the heading of personal chattels as per the following quotation from Mr. McPherson's memoranda re Cars, Cameras and Radios:

"It should be remembered that under the law the Custodian only becomes vested with those Motor Vehicles which were delivered up in accordance with the Minister of Justice Order, and the Motor Vehicles which were not delivered up in accordance with that order only vest in the Custodian as of the date of the registration of the Japanese owner, or as of the date of his evacuation. In either of these events the Motor Vehicle is then under the Custodian's control, the same as ordinary chattels, and is handled in accordance with the general rules of policy relating to chattels, rather than in accordance with the policy set down in this memorandum."

As you are dealing with personal chattels, is it your wish that I recognize Mr. Kennington's transfer and execute it for him in order that he may take delivery of the car?

For your information Mr. Shiraishi was evacuated to Tashme a day or so after selling the car.
