

It is believed that all this property has been sold by the Commission and that the proceeds which are in excess of \$2000,00 are in the hands of the Commission. In addition the deceased had a \$5000.00 Life Insurance Policy with the Monarch Life. This policy is payable to thewidow. The deceased left a Will leaving all his property to his eldest son, Keitaro Kadonaga. The executors named in the Will are two other sons Takeshi Kadonaga and Minoru Kadonaga.
