

CHATELS:

5 fishing nets and 38# Barbour twine were sold for Jimpe TASAKA by Johnston Fishing & Packing Co., and the net proceeds - \$371.82 paid to the Custodian. See Chattel Summary for further details. One net remains unsold.

TASAKA declared he had sold his float dwelling to S. Pulok, R.R.1, New Westminster, prior to his declaration and this was confirmed by our fieldman.

SPECIFIED  
ARTICLES:

Jimpe TASAKA'S fishing vessel "J.T." was sold by the Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee under their No.398, to Nelson Bros. Fisheries Ltd., for \$850.00, and the purchase price less supervision costs - \$11.00 paid to TASAKA on April 11th, 1942, by J.F.V.D.C.

BANK ACCOUNT:

The Bank of Nova Scotia, New Westminster, advised the Custodian on February 11th, 1944, that Jimpe TASAKA had an inoperative savings account on their books of \$2057.78. This was not brought under the control of the Custodian. He also declared a deposit account of \$1,000.00 with Canadian Bank of Commerce, New Westminster, which did not come under control of Custodian.


SECURITIES:

The declarant stated he had a \$100.00 Victory Bond in his own possession. This was not brought under the control of the Custodian.

ACCOUNTS  
RECEIVABLE:

The declarant stated he had no moneys owing to him, but on February 1st, 1946, TASAKA advised the Custodian that Seishi MUKAI, File 11973, owed him the sum of \$390.69 and that MUKAI'S wife had arranged with Messrs. McLennan, McFeely & Prior to refund to the Custodian the cost of goods returned to them by MUKAI to cover this debt. On enquiries by phone on February 6th, 1946, McLennan, McFeely & Prior denied any knowledge of this transaction. Jimpe TASAKA was advised of this on February 6th, 1946, and told to obtain an order from MUKAI on the Custodian to pay the account from any funds at the credit of MUKAI. File 5470 reveals that Mrs. S. MUKAI, his wife, sent an order on the Custodian dated November 23rd, 1945, to pay Jimpe TASAKA the sum of \$390.69, which she claimed as her debt. Her file does not, however, reveal that she admitted this when making her declaration to the Custodian and she has no funds at her credit on the Custodian's books. Seichi Mukai on April 8/46 requested the Custodian to deduct his debt to Tasaka from his credit balance with the Custodian. No other property interests other than the above are found on this file.



The declarant states on his JP Form that he has sold his house to S. Puleo, R.R. #1, New Westminster. As the result of enquiries by our fieldman, S.G. Carlson, it was found that this was a float house and it had been sold, together with other floats belonging to Jimpe TASAKA to Steve Palok of Timberland Mill Ltd., prior to TASAKA'S evacuation.

Jimpe TASAKA declared to the Custodian that he had no chattels, but on November 13th, 1945, he informed this office that 6 Fishing Nets and some Barbour Twine were left by him at Johnston Fishing & Packing Co. His list of nets, however, only shows 5 nets. On January 12th, 1946, the Johnston Fishing & Packing Co. forwarded the Custodian the sum of \$321.82, representing the proceeds from the sale of 3 nets and 38# of Barbour Twine belonging to TASAKA. On January 30th, 1946, they sent a further sum of \$50.00 for a fourth net sold by them. One net 150 fathom 5 5/8 - 50/100 mesh remains in the hands of Johnston Fishing & Packing Co., unsold, in accordance with their letter of January 30th, 1946. The sum of \$371.82 was placed to the credit of Jimpe TASAKA and he and Johnston Fishing & Packing Co. have both been advised that as far as the Custodian is concerned there will be no objection to their disposing of this net in any manner mutually satisfactory to them, but that this office requests a report as to its disposition.





Dear Tasaka:

We have for reply your letter of Dec. 11 regarding some used nets and twine left with us for sale.

We note that you state that you have written us several times before and received no answer. This is the first time we have received any letter from you and as we did not know your address we were unable to correspond with you regarding your nets.

Two of your nets are still at the cannery as we have been unable to sell them at the prices asked/. However seeing that we could not get in touch with you, we sold the other three at the best prices we could obtain for them. We thought it better to do this than to allow them to stay around too long as they would be worth very little in time.

We also note that you put a valuation of \$144.00 on 38lbs. of Barbour twine. This price is incorrect. The wholesale price of new twine at the time for the same quantity was \$96.82. This is the price for which it was sold. We enclose statement itemized showing the price of the different grades. Copies of statement are enclosed herewith showing complete transactions and we are forwarding our cheque in the amount of \$321.82 to the Custodian's office under instructions from our Auditor.

With reference to your request of January 9th, 1946 asking us to remit the sum of \$321.82 now at your credit, your file has been reviewed and the following is noted:

Mitsugi YAMASHITA and Yukio HASEBE claimed that you owed them \$159.17 and \$162.77, respectively. It is further noted that you denied owing them these amounts. However, neither of these persons have withdrawn their claims and this office therefore, is unable to release your funds until this matter is settled.

Yukio HASEBE's address is at Midway, B. C. while, Mitsugi YAMASHITA is located at Kaslo, B. C. and we suggest that you write them and obtain a clearance of your debts if they are paid.

In the meantime we have received a further remittance of \$50.00 from the Johnston Fishing and Packing Company for your 150 fathoms Gill net 5 1/4 X 5 5/8 X 30 mesh.

On December 28th, 1945, we received a letter from Mr. Brown, a copy of which is enclosed. Mr. Tasaka is now in receipt of a letter from Mr. Mukai stating that Mukai's property has been sold and that he has the funds to meet Tasaka's claim of \$390.69. Mr. Mukai further asks Tasaka why he does not get payment of the money owing. Will you kindly look into this matter for us.

Regarding letter of February 4th, 1946, sent to Mr. Tasaka from the Custodian's office, File Number 5171, with reference to certain claims against Mr. Tasaka, Mitsugi Yamashita, \$159.17, this amount was repaid fourteen years ago. As Yamashita's claim is for a debt of fourteen years back Mr. Tasaka claims that it could not possibly be legal and cannot understand why a claim that is not legal is recognized by the Custodian.

Regarding Yukio Hasebe's claim for \$162.77, this claim was repaid to Hasebe's father twenty years ago and the same facts as pertain to Yamashita apply in this case. Also Yukio Hasebe borrowed \$200.00 from Tasaka in 1942 through the medium of Steve Fulseio of R.R. No. 1, New Westminster, and acknowledgment of this money is contained on the postcard enclosed, which is written in Japanese.

Tasaka's whole point, however, is the question of why will the Custodian retain funds to satisfy some claim that has not been, and cannot be legally established and that it seems strange to Tasaka that people can tie up funds of another simply on their say so without substantiating their claim.

As we know nothing about the facts concerning this case, all the remarks contained herein are statements made by Mr. Tasaka and are merely a reiteration of statements and opinions of Tasaka.

In reply to yours of the 27th, ultimo, together with which you forwarded a copy of Mr. Ernst's letter of February 21st, 1946, we have reviewed Mr. TASAKA'S file and find that Mitsugi YAMASHITA and Yukio HASEBE file their claims against TASAKA in 1942, with a large number of other claims, against TASAKA.

When TASAKA denied owing the accounts in 1944 we notified these creditors and advised them that the Custodian would take no further action in view of Mr. TASAKA'S denial. From time to time however, HASEBE, in part, submitted a list of accounts to our Claims Department and TASAKA'S name was included and it would appear that the latter would have saved himself a lot of trouble had he written these two Japanese to obtain a clearance of their claims. We do know too, that the bookkeeping amongst these fishermen and fish dealers was very faulty.

In regard to TASAKA'S claim against Seishi MUKAI, File 11973. This was never heard of before February 1st, 1946, and we wrote him to the effect that MUKAI had never acknowledged the claim but on the other hand MUKAI'S wife had given an order on November 23rd, 1945 to the Custodian to pay TASAKA, \$390.69 which she stated was her debt and we notified your Department on December 20th, 1945 that this woman had no funds at her credit. We notice by the way, that this order was witnessed by Seishi MUKAI and we enclose a copy for your information.

In our letter of February 6th, 1946 to Jimpe TASAKA we suggested that he obtain an order from Seishi MUKAI to transfer this amount of \$390.69 from his funds, which we have in a joint account with another Japanese. If we can receive this order we shall be able to make the necessary adjustments. In the meantime will you kindly convey this information Mr. Ernst as we do not feel that it is necessary to repeat our request in this matter to TASAKA. If Mr. Ernst could obtain the order we shall appreciate it.

The Custodian desires to give you a summary of your file so that the balance of funds at your credit may be remitted. However, before we do this there are certain matters that you have not yet cleaned up, namely, the debt owed to you by Seishi MUKAI.

We have already advised you that Shoshi MUKAI had no further funds at her credit and if the money is really owed to you by her husband, Seishi, you should obtain an order on the joint account of Seishi MUKAI and Kanichi MATSUDA. For this purpose we forwarded through the Department of Labour & P&W for their signatures (the order should be signed by both MUKAI & MATSUDA). W-. MUKAI'S address is Shaughnessy, Alta. and Mrs. MATSUDA'S Edmonton, Alta.

We note that you claimed 6 nets and some Barbour twined was left with the Johnston Fishing & Packing Company whereas the correspondence between you and that Company mentions only five nets. Four of the nets and the twine were accounted for and 1 net remains unsold.

Will you kindly write us on the above matter.

Dear Sir:

We have received your request to forward all funds at your credit with the Custodian and now enclose Custodian cheque in the amount of \$762.51 which closes your account.

On April 18, 1942 you signed a declaration to the Custodian to the effect that you owned no property in the protected area of British Columbia with the exception of a \$100 Victory Bond in your own possession and two bank deposits in the sum of \$1000 each. At a later date we were advised by the Bank of Nova Scotia that you had \$2057.78 on deposit but none of the foregoing were brought under the control of the Custodian.

On November 13, 1945 you asked this office to communicate with the Johnston Fishing & Packing Co. relative to your fish nets which you had left with them for sale. In response to our inquiries this Company forwarded the sum of \$371.82 being the proceeds from the sale of 5 nets and 38 pounds of Barbour Twine. This money was placed to your credit in this office. One net is apparently still held by the Johnston Fishing & Packing Co. pending an agreement with you as to price. We understand that you are in direct touch with this company regarding this and we are writing to tell them that as far as the Custodian is concerned there will be no objection to your disposing of this net in any manner that you see fit, but we do request that as a matter of record this office must be advised.

The records of the Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee indicate that your fishing boat "J.T." was sold for \$850.00 from which \$11.00 was deducted for supervising costs, leaving the net sum of \$839.00 which was paid to you on April 11, 1942.

On February 1st, 1946 you asked the Custodian to collect the sum of \$390.69 from Saichi Mukai, but at that time no funds belonging to this man were available in this office to apply on this debt. As a result of the liquidation of assets however, Mr. Mukai has now sufficient funds to transfer to your account as requested by him the sum of \$390.69 which together with \$371.82 derived from sale of nets is represented in the enclosed cheque.
