PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARYRe: UYEDA, Taneichi - Reg. No. 06595.

The above signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 23, 1942 and was evacuated on June 29, 1942.

CHATELS: He declared a quantity of household goods left in the house formerly occupied by him and built on land belonging to the Great Northern Cannery, Francis Millerd & Co. On June 26 he declared that the goods were still stored at the same place, in the care of Francis Millerd Co and that he had lent the furniture, for the duration of the war, to Mrs. Sanston who was occupying his house.

We sent the Cannery a list of the chattels left in their care and they advised us that two of the four beds listed were not there also the sewing machine. The box of carpenter tools and machine tools was sent to UYEDA on the day prior to his departure for the interior. UYEDA was asked to indicate if what was left consisted all his chattels but failed to reply. In January 1946 he wrote directly to the cannery and offered them all his chattels for \$150.00. The Cannery accepted and forwarded us a cheque for the total sum which was credited to his account.

MONEYS OWING: A refund of B. C. Electric Security Deposit for Light was received in July 1945 - \$2.46.

BONDS: He declared one \$100.00 War Bond and \$5.00 War Savings Certificate in his own possession. These were not brought under the control of the Custodian.

BANK ACCOUNT: He declared \$679.00 in the Japan & Canada Trust Savings Bank, Account No. U. 399. His name does not appear on any list of depositors and we can only presume that the account was closed prior to his evacuation.

SAFETY DEPOSIT

BOX: He also declared that he had a safety deposit box at the Japan and Canada Trust Savings Bank but did not know the number, P. S. Ross & Sons who are winding up the affairs of that bank advise that they have no knowledge of any deposit boxes.

Total credit \$152.46 remitted to Treasury Department - Account closed.

This file reveals no assets other than those mentioned above.


