Acknowledging your letter of May 16th regarding Tamegusu Machida, the writer was manager at Arrandale Cannery when the Japanese were moved off the Coast, arriving there a month or so after they had left Arrandale.

with regard to the high speed engine and row boat there were no such articles at the cannery on his arrival. The Jap houses had been broken into by the local Indians and everything of value taken away. It is possible the engine and boat referred to by Machida and which he puts in a claim for were stolen at that time.

Regarding the net, attached is a list of the nets we had in our net loft belonging to Japanese in the Spring of the year they left. You will note there is no record of a net belonging to Machida in this list.

We also attach a list of nets left at our British America Cannery by Japanese and sold there.

It is unfortunate that you did not take the trouble to supply this office with the description and location of articles left by you in the protected area, as we would then have had some information to work on in endeavouring to find and protect your effects.
