CHATTEL SUMMARY

Box Icao Estima High streetion No. 04298 December No. 12, 1972,

In his declaration of April 7, 1942, TSURDRA declared certain chattels left in the protected area (See Chattel Schedule). He also had a four (4) ross shack and have which he had built on the property omed by one Hrs. Ids B. Steeves being a Test fourth of lets 46, 47, 45 being a piece of land situated on the west and of the said lots 16,47,48 extending eastward 10 rods from the most and of the said lots:

In a statement received from Ero. Steeres, 250mmA was \$72.00 in runt arrears. After evacuation that Steeres rested a portion of this land to a Mr. P. Procepation for \$15.00 this arount was deducted from the acount owing by 250mmA and \$56.00 rest arrears was paid in full to Mrs. Steeres on September 17, 1943.

An arrungement mas made with Hrs. Steeres whereby the buildings were remted by the "istodian to a Brs. L. J. Thompson for \$6.00 per month plus \$2.00 for water rates. The tenset was allowed one-growth's free rent to make the buildings habitable. The file reveals/a letter of October 12, 1966, that Hrs. Steeves had entered into a sale of the property with the Director, The Veterans' fand Act and on the same date, the Director was notified that the Omstodian had an unregistered interest in the property, that is, the buildings. On October 13, 1966, the Gustodian was notified by the Director that the land was purchased free of all encountrances and Hrs. Steeves had notified the Director she gave no permission for the exection of any buildings on her property, but intimated to them she had told TSUMURA that he might remove the buildings if he deemed to do so at the expiration of the Lesse. No apprecial of the buildings was made by their appreciar as he did not consider the buildings as adding my value to the land, Hospver, the Director would have no objection to the "ustedian removing the buildings. In a further letter from the Director on Navamber 9, 1966, he states the Regional Supervisor had reported the buildings were detrimental to the property and not worth moving to some other locality. The maximum salvage value would not exceed \$50.00.

The Unitedian then endeavoured to sell the buildings for their salvage value. The only offer received was from Thomas Lealie in which he offered to pull down and remove the shacks and clean up this property for thatever he could detain out of the salvage. As the Director requested the removal of the buildings, the Shears, the Castadian's Director, agreed to allow Mr. Lealie denotish the buildings as par his offer.

File Se. 1722 October 28, 1946. 100 the Chatedian removed to storage a few dishes cally. Br. Harris, Castodian's agent, in a report of Howester 50, 101, states that he was inferred by Brs. Showes that the buildings had been bedly remarked and only drine had been salvaged. (See Chattel Schedule).
