PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

July 17, 1946.

Re: Katsuya FUKAKUSA, Reg. No. 09268

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 22, 1942. He was interned on May 16, 1942 and released on May 27, 1943.

In his declaration he reported a trumpet left at Duncan, B.C. This was shipped to him in July, 1942.

He reported \$60.00 in War Savings Certificates in his father's custody. When this man was interned these vested in the Custodian and on June 22, 1942 we received thirteen \$5.00 War Savings Certificates from his father, which were placed in our safety deposit box. On June 21, 1943 these were sent to FUKAKUSA as he had been released.

He reported a \$1,500.00 life insurance policy with the Manufacturers Life Insurance Co. in the company's possession. This man applied for the cash surrender value of the policy and on July 13, 1942 we received the amount of \$80.22 as the surrender value and this was credited to his account.

The account of this man was credited with the sum of \$5.74 received as refund of 1% wage deduction for 1941.

The R.C.M.P. handed to this office a home-made battery set radio and a Kodak camera. The radio was sold through this office and the net proceeds in the amount of \$13.07 were credited to this man's account. The radio was missing from our warehouse as at March 15, 1946. *See letter of July 24/46 camera*

On September 15, 1942 at this man's request we remitted \$60.00 to his father at Hastings Park. On that date we remitted \$15.00 to FUKAKUSA at the internment camp.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

This summary is certified to be in accordance with information on file.

There is a balance of \$24.03 standing to your credit with this office at the present time.

In your declaration to the Custodian on April 22, 1943, you reported a trumpet left c/o Mr. T. McEwan, Duncan, B.C. Our records show that this trumpet was shipped to you in July, 1942.

You reported \$50.00 in War Savings Certificates in the custody of your father. Thirteen \$5.00 War Savings Certificates were sent to you on June 21, 1943.

You reported a \$1,500.00 life insurance policy with the Manufacturers Life Insurance Co. On July 13, 1942 your account with this office was credited with the sum of \$80.22 received from the Manufacturers Life Insurance Co. as the cash surrender value of this policy.

Your account with this office was credited with the sum of \$5.74 received as refund of 1% wage deduction for 1941.

The R.C.M.P. handed to this office a home-made battery radio which had been surrendered by you. This radio was sold at auction and the net proceeds of \$13.07 were credited to your account. If you will send in the receipt given to you at the time your radio was surrendered we will be in a position to remit this amount to you.

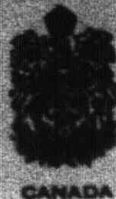
The R.C.M.P. also handed to this office a Kodak camera surrendered by you. This camera was placed in our warehouse and we regret to inform you that at the present time it cannot be located. We have taken all reasonable measures for protection of personal goods, involving considerable expense in the employment of caretakers, watchmen and night patrol but in spite of this from time to time break-ins and occurred and items stolen. It would appear that your camera might have been taken under such circumstances. The police have been made aware of this situation and if your camera should be recovered you will of course be advised.

On September 15, 1942 at your request we remitted \$60.00 to your father and on that date we remitted \$15.00 to you.

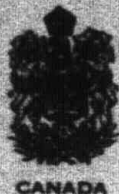



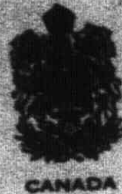
