MEMORANDUM: File 5362

October 16, 1944.

Re: Kazuo YONEMURA, #09192

The camera referred to in this file was not reported to the Custodian by the RCMP.

The first information we had was when Yonemura wrote on September 18, 1943, asking for the release of his camera and enclosing the receipt he had received from the RCMP, Vernon.

According to RCMP letter of October 13, 1944, this camera was handed over to Mr. J. Lister on October 7, 1943.

We have no further information in regard to this camera or Mr. Lister.

GENERAL SUMMARY

Re: Kazuo YONEMURA, Reg.No. 09194

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 22, 1942. He was evacuated on April 28, 1942.

In his declaration he reported \$40.00 in War Savings Certificates in his own possession and a Life Insurance Policy, Dominion Life, in his own possession. Neither of these came under the control of the Custodian.

On September 19, 1943, this man asked that his camera be returned to him. This office had no knowledge of this camera. On October 13, 1944, the R.C.M.P. informed this office that the camera had been handed over to Mr. J. Lister on October 7, 1943. We believe Mr. Lister was an employee of the B. C. Security Commission.

The Duncan District Credit Bureau filed a claim of \$50.00 against this man on behalf of Dr. Bissett, Watson, McMillie & Beevor-Potts, of Duncan, B. C. This was referred to Kazuo YONEMURA who denied that he had at any time received treatment from these doctors. The claim was transferred to the file of his brother, Kazuma, File 8222.

This file reveals no other assets or liabilities.
