HISTORY OF
ADMINISTRATION: The Custodian's representative reported on May 20th,
1942, that this property consisted of 3 City lots
with a small frame barn thereon, in fair condition,
and also that this was registered in the names of
Toshimichi URAISAMI and his brother, Seiji URAISAMI,
as Joint Tenants. This, however, was found to be in
error as the title was registered as Tenants in Common.

The lots adjoining the barn were rented at \$5.00 for
the season of 1943 to Joseph Bordeleau for garden
purposes.

Owing to the difficulty in finding storage facilities,
the Custodian took over this property for storage
purposes on March 9th, 1943, for payment of taxes.

SOLD: To Stanley Jervis for \$450.00 cash.
Approval of Advisory Committee - 1st June, 1944.

Adjustments were calculated as of July 3rd, 1944.

Funds credited to the joint account of Seiji
and Toshimichi URAISAMI, in the amount of \$450.00,
on November 24th, 1944. This amount, less
disbursements, was then divided and the net
amount of \$220.00 was credited to each Evacuee's
account.

Title No. 177133-E in the name of Stanley Jervis
delivered on November 30th, 1944.

A complete statement of the sale of this property was
forwarded to both Japanese on January 15th, 1945.

PROTEST:

Seiji URAISAMI states in his letter of October 23rd, 1944, in reply to our request to send in his title:

"As we intend to hold the property for the duration of the war I do not see any need for the title, therefore I would retain the title."

GENERAL SUMMARY

Re: Yoshinichi URAISAMI
Ken. No. 04129

With reference to the Chattel Summary, the Custodian's Investigating Agent, Mr. J. D. Mather, in reporting on May 26, 1942, enclosed with his report an inventory of nets. Upon investigation, on closing this file, it was found that this inventory was not a physical inventory taken by Mr. Mather, but an inventory taken by his assistant, Mr. Thomas C. King, from a ledger in the possession of the Imperial Cannery.

When the evacuation orders were received from the Government, Mr. Eric Lowe, of the Imperial Cannery, handed the Head Japanese Collector a record ledger and instructed him to have all Japanese, in their different canneries, list their nets which they had stored in the net houses belonging to the B. C. Packers group. This record was taken and turned into the cannery. The cannery officers did not check the lists of nets in this record book and took no responsibility for the accuracy of the lists or for the net themselves.

On the basis of the list of nets in this record book certain nets were sold from time to time by the net bosses in the canneries to the canneries themselves or to fishermen. The balance of the nets were removed by the Custodian from the cannery net houses to the Takahashi net house, which was selected to be used by the Custodian for storage of nets and fishing gear. Before, or at the time of removal, an inventory of these nets was taken by Mr. C. C. Robinson, the Custodian's Agent at Steveston.

The writer, on a visit to Steveston on January 25, 1946, persuaded the cannery to give these records to the Custodian. On checking the list of nets belonging to Yoshinichi URAISAMI, found on his file, we find that the inventory taken by the Custodian's Investigating Agent, Mr. J. D. Mather, was an exact copy of what the Japanese had placed in this book, and the prices entered therein were Yoshinichi URAISAMI's own estimation of the value of his nets. On telephoning Mr. Mather on January 17, 1946, he admitted that he left the checking of nets to Mr. Thomas C. King and Mr. King, at the same time, admitted that he had only taken the inventory from the books as above mentioned.

- Page 2 -

On further check of the Record Books, it was found that lines were scored through a written description of a net, $4/40 \times 5\frac{1}{2} \times 60 - 200$, and pencilled in the side were the words "\$150.00 - OK", and the signature, "Seiji URAISAMI". In a general statement dated July 9, 1942, sent in by the B. C. Packers, of nets purchased by them, showed the owner of a net to be "F. URAISAMI", giving the above net size and the price of \$150.00. As we did not have a registered URAISAMI, with the initial "F", this was assumed to belong to Seiji URAISAMI and the funds credited to him. Whereas, the file revealed that this net belonged to his brother, Toshimichi URAISAMI, and the funds were later transferred to Toshimichi URAISAMI.


Further investigation of the ledger account of Toshimichi URAISAMI, there were four nets pencilled out with the amounts okayed on the side, in the same method, and marked "Sold to the B. C. P.". We did not have a record of ever receiving the money and on checking with the cannery, we found that the cannery had paid Seiji URAISAMI on July, 1942, \$515.00 for fishing nets which included the four items crossed out. Altogether, approximately, \$740.00 was paid out to the two brothers.

The Custodian was not notified of the transaction by the B. C. Packers, or by Seiji URAISAMI, or by Toshimichi URAISAMI. These items were never stricken off the inventory lists sent in by Mr. Mather and would not be accounted for.

Subsequent to the removal of the balance of the nets to the Takahashi net house, Mr. Robinson proceeded to effect sale upon the appraisal of the nets by Mr. Leckie, but when he sent in a sales receipt to the Custodian, the sizes of the nets did not, in most cases, correspond with the inventory sizes given by the Japanese. This office cannot explain this difference.

April 29, 1946. It has now been found that the amount paid into this office by the B. C. Packers, namely, \$150.00, on July 9, 1942, was sent to this office in error by the company as they had already paid this money to Seishi URAISAMI, the brother of Toshimichi URAISAMI. We are today refunding this amount to the B. C. Packers.

MEMO TO FILE: Re: P/W A-335, URAISIMI, Toshimichi. Reg. #04129

The above named and his brother, Seiji URAISIMI, Reg. #05292, an evacuee, are joint owners of Lots 4, 5, and 6, Block 21 of Section 3, Block 3, North Range 7, West Map 249, in the District of New Westminster, Municipality of Richmond, on which is situate a frame barn. This property comprises $\frac{1}{4}$ acre and each brother holds one half interest.

The property is vested and there are no encumbrances.

The land is not under cultivation. Taxes for 1942 in amount of \$19.08 were paid by Mr. Seiji Uraisimi. It was drawn to his attention in September, 1942 that no insurance is carried on the property but he advised that he did not wish to place same and would accept full responsibility.

Mr. Thomas C. King advised on September 11th that there is absolutely no chance of renting this place as it is too small and the barn could not be used for a dwelling. He stated that the property is in a good locality and might sell for around \$800.00 or \$900.00. However, Mr. Uraisimi wants to hold the property with an idea of erecting a home later on.

Internee has a \$1000.00 20-year endowment policy in Sun Life Assurance Co. Premium - \$49.90.

Internee owns or owned nets valued by him at \$1017.00. This is believed to be a very high estimate. I am unable to ascertain whether these have been sold or not. 2 dinghys owned by him were sold for \$10.00 each - total \$20.00 and credited to his account.

His credit balance amounts to \$110.00 and in September, 1942, he had \$42.82 at the Internment Camp.

His only liability appears to be a claim for \$17.50 filed by Mr. J. D. Mather, 315 Metropolitan Building, for investigation services. Should this not be paid?



MEMORANDUM — TO THE FILE

April 29, 1946.

After Toshimichi URAISAMI had made his declaration to the Custodian on April 24, 1942, Seichi URAISAMI, a brother of Toshimichi, sold direct to the B. C. Packers, without the knowledge or consent of the Custodian, the following net which belonged to Toshimichi URAISAMI: 4/40 x 5 1/2 x 60 x 200 on lines, in the amount of \$150.00. The funds were paid to Seichi URAISAMI.

Through an error, the B. C. Packers again paid this amount to the Custodian on July 9, 1942, under the name of F. URAISAMI. As the initial was incorrect this should have been Toshimichi. The B. C. Packers have asked for a return of this amount in their letter of April 4, 1946.





Dear Sir:

The real property declared by you and situated on Chathan Street near 2nd Avenue, Steveston, was found to be in the names of yourself and your brother, Seiji URAISAMI, as tenants in common.

The barn situated on your property was used by the Custodian for the storage of Japanese chattels, for which the Custodian paid the taxes and other rates. In addition, \$5.00 was received for a portion of the land for garden purposes in the year of 1943.

This property was sold on July 3, 1944, for \$450.00, and adjustments were calculated as of this date. This amount, less disbursements, was credited equally between your account and the account of your brother, Seiji. A complete statement of this sale was forwarded to you on January 15, 1945.

Although you did not declare your fishing boat, "T.U. Margaret", your file indicates that this was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee and the amount of \$641.00 was paid direct to you on April 15, 1942.

Fishing nets declared by you and found in your name in the Imperial Cannery net houses at Steveston were sold and credited to your account. One rowboat, which was found in the barn on your property, was sold and also credited to your account.

From records obtained from the B. C. Packers it was found that after your declaration was made you and your brother, Seiji, without the knowledge or consent of the Custodian, sold fishing equipment to this company and at no time did you notify the Custodian of this transaction so that the files of this office could be rectified.

From time to time, as requested by you, payments of premiums for your life insurance policy were paid by this office.

Through remittances paid to you, and the repayment of \$150.00 to the B. C. Packers, there are no funds left standing to your credit with this office.

It would appear that we have accounted for all property of every kind left by you in the Protected Area which vested in the Custodian. In order that you may confirm this we are enclosing a stamped, addressed envelope for your convenience in replying.

From the two statements I have investigated
I have still a balance of \$150.00 + \$57.68 = \$207.68.
I wish you to make an investigation and if you
find it out I was correct please send the
\$207.68 immediately as the repatriation most
likely to occur around May 24. I presume
you will co-operate with me and have the
thing settled in the very nearest moment.
