The first six creditors did not file claims against Miss YANO so possibly they were settled.

7. A claim was filed against Nobuko YANO by Searles's Shoes in the amount of \$7.20. This claim was originally against J. YANO, Nobuko's father, who is deceased. Miss YANO was advised of this claim on January 15, 1945, and April 6, 1945, but no acknowledgment was received from her. Creditor advised to deal direct, Aug. 28/47
8. On April 15, 1942, a claim was filed against Miss YANO by Cumberland Electric Lighting Company in the amount of \$52.45. On October 24, 1942, a claim in the amount of \$9.32 was received from the Cumberland Waterworks. The following is an extract from our letter of January 15, 1945, to Miss YANO:

"We do not know whether No. 8 as originally lodged for \$52.45 has been settled or not, as the Cumberland & Union Waterworks lodged a later claim for \$9.32, and as this is the same Company as the Lighting Company we are not sure just what the position is with this Company."

However, Miss YANO did not acknowledge either claim in answer to our letter and creditors were advised to deal direct on August 28, 1947.

9. Miss YANO reported a debt owing to Mr. MATSUKUCHI of \$116.45. A claim in this amount was not filed against her but a claim in the amount of \$104.00 was filed by Tokitaro MATSUKUCHI. Miss YANO did not acknowledge our letter in regard to this claim so creditor was advised to deal direct on August 28, 1947.
10. Miss YANO did not acknowledge our letter in regard to the claim filed against her by Mr. Y. KISHIMOTO so creditor was advised to deal direct on August 28, 1947.

This file reveals no further liabilities.

PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

This woman signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 23, 1942. She was evacuated on July 21, 1942.

REAL ESTATE

Miss YANO declared a two-story house, valued at \$700.00, on property owned by Canadian Colliers (Dunsmuir). On August 26, 1942, we wrote to Miss YANO informing her that we had been advised by the Canadian Colliers that she had been permitted to build on the land and occupy the premises only while she remained an employee of the Company, and that the building was now the property of the Company. She was told that we would have to accept the statement of the Company unless she could submit evidence of her right to retain ownership of the house. No reply was received to this letter and no reply was received to our letter of September 19, 1942. On October 3, 1942, a report was received from Matt Brown in regard to this property. He stated that no rent had been paid on the house since July, 1928 and that the house was now vacant and nailed up. On August 28, 1943, we informed Miss YANO that the Canadian Colliers had agreed to pay an estimated salvage value for the buildings on their land and as a result, the sum of \$25.00 had been credited to her account from this source. This amount was remitted to Miss YANO on August 28, 1943.

CHATELS

Miss YANO declared a large quantity of household effects and furniture left at Cumberland Storage and House #161, Cumberland. (See JP Form and attached lists.) Matt Brown's report of October 3, 1942, states that all effects of value were shipped and the balance, being very old and of little value, were left in the home. From this it would appear that the effects which Miss YANO declared left in storage were shipped to her and those declared to be left at House 161 were discarded as being of little value.

BONDS

Miss YANO declared \$50.00 in War Savings Certificates. These did not come into the possession of the Custodian.

Dear Madam:

The Custodian is pleased to inform you that arrangements have now been completed whereby Canadian Collieries (Dunsmuir) Limited, have taken over numerous houses on their properties that were at one time occupied by persons of the Japanese race.

As the Company owned the land, the right to use and occupy such buildings was contingent upon payment of a nominal rent. We are informed that the right of occupation and use of any structure on the land was to terminate if the occupier ceased to be an employee of the Company. The Corporation, however, agreed to pay an estimated salvage value for the buildings, and pursuant to the agreement, the Company's Inspection Engineer, along with our agent, appraised each building on the basis of its value to the Company, in connection with their building plan.

You occupied the building known as House No. 161, No. 5 Japanese Town, and the award fixed as aforesaid amounted to \$25.00. Your account has, therefore, been credited with this sum.

The Collieries as per their letter of March 2nd, 1943, in file Q/92, assert their ownership, and so far as this department is concerned in this circumstance, it does not seem that anything more has to be done. The interests of the declarants in the houses however, will require some attention, and you may desire to refer these interests to another department. If not, I shall be pleased to have your comment as to what action should be taken.

Dear Madam:

In making declaration of your property to the Custodian, you claimed to be the owner of a house built by you on land owned by the Canadian Collieries Limited at Cumberland, B.C. We have been informed by the Canadian Collieries that you were permitted to build upon this land and occupy the premises only while you remained an employee of the Company, and that the building is now the property of the Company.

While we desire to protect your ownership of the house, we shall have to accept the statement of the Company unless you can submit some evidence of your right to retain ownership of the house. I suggest that, to this end, you give me information on the following questions:

1. When you built this house did you get a lease of the land from the Company; or did you belong to an association which was granted a lease of a larger area of land of which the land on which your house is situated is a part, and if so, can you give me the name and address of the party holding this lease? Any lease of the land occupied should be sent to me for inspection.
2. Have you any letter or other document from the Company giving you the right to occupy the land, and, if so, please send such letter or document to me.
3. Did you occupy this land only by verbal permission of the Company?
4. Are you supposed to pay rent to the Company, and do you propose to continue paying it?
5. Was there any understanding between you and the Company that the house should become the property of the Company if and when you quit working for the Company?

If you still consider yourself owner of this house it is important that you should write me at once giving such information as you may be able in substantiation of your claim.
