"Tsukimi" - \$12.25

The sum of \$12.25 was credited to the account of Iwakichi YOSHIDA, Reg. No. 12106, File 5369, in connection with the above claim, on April 11, 1945. This sum was being held in the account, however, because the claim had been listed under the name "Ishimatsu YOSHIDA" of whom the R.C.M.F. have no record.

Mr. Kishio KIMURA, formerly a member of the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee, has advised in regard to these claims:

"At the time when the Japanese Fishing Vessels Disposal Committee undertook to approve sales of the vessels many complaints were lodged verbally by the owners or navigators pertaining to their expenses, so I requested the approved agents (contact men) to make a list of claimants. It is obvious that during the process of making up this list some of the names may have been miss spelled by my stenographer who had difficulty in reading handwritten Japanese characters, especially names."

Iwakichi YOSHIDA was the owner of the "Tsukimi".

We have been informed by Itaro TERASHITA, File 1586, formerly a fisherman at Valnelet (as was Iwakichi YOSHIDA) that he believes that I. Yoshida brought his boat to Steveston at the time of the impounding, and he suggested that we get in touch with the widow of I. Yoshida at Lemon Creek. Iwakichi YOSHIDA is deceased and his widow lives at Lemon Creek.

I consider that we have sufficient grounds for believing that Iwakichi YOSHIDA was the man who brought the "Tsukimi" to Steveston, and think the \$12.25 may be released to the open credit of this man's estate.

Would you, therefore, please cancel the "hold funds" notation on the ledger in respect to this sum?

Thank you for yours of September 22nd, dealing with the above Japanese and his fishing equipment.

He is not accurate in saying it was left in the custody of the Custodian at the time of evacuation. Actually, his registration of April 24th, 1942, declared only a few articles of furniture left at Ucluelet. Most of these were reported by our agent as being of insufficient value to move.

It was not until September 1st, 1943, that he wrote to us saying he had left two sets of gurdies at Bamfield near the house of Mr. Iwakazu Kakiuchi which he had omitted to register before evacuation.

We made investigations and secured Iwakazu Kakiuchi's confirmation that a six-spool gurdie belonging to Iwakichi Yoshida, had been left on his premises at Bamfield. We accordingly wrote to the latter on November 11th stating that his claim had been noted and placed on file for further attention.

We should mention that a number of eight and six spool gurdies, mostly unidentified, were picked up at Bamfield by the Navy against a receipt handed to our Victoria agents. No decision re compensation, if any, payable for such equipment has yet been reached nor does it seem likely that any decision will be arrived at for some time to come.

We trust that this is the information you require. We would further add that as Mr. Iwakichi Yoshida knows, we have a credit in his account of \$275.06 represented mostly by proceeds of sale of his fishing boat. This

In his declaration of April 21st, this Japanese registered "trolling equipment valued at \$200.00 in House No. 7 of the Booths-Bamfield Packing Co. at Ucluelet." This Cannery is actually situated at Port Albion opposite Ucluelet.

An enquiry to the N. B. P. C. was answered by them saying that all Japanese articles left behind in the Houses owned by the Company (which covers the residences occupied by Japanese at Port Albion) were removed by our Victoria agents. Reference to these agents on July 10th, 1942, brought the answer that they had no record of this man's name but that perhaps his equipment had been stored in the house of another Japanese at Port Albion. If it was of value, it would have been turned over to the Navy.

Reference to lists of equipment at Ucluelet turned over to the Navy (Refer to our file G/66) shows no unidentified trolling equipment. On August 11th, 1942, we wrote to Mr. Nishi for more information. He answered on August 24th indicating:

(1) Trolling equipment was left both at House No. 7 and House No. 8 at Port Albion.

(2) A "trolling machine" valued at over \$200.00 was left at Yoshikazu Kawaguchi's house at Bamfield. This is quite a different place, several hours away across Barclay Sound.

Further correspondence with our Victoria agents led to the suggestion that more information be asked for and this was received from Mr. Nishi on September 30th, 1942 as follows.

(1) Trolling equipment was left at his house No. 7 and Iwakichi Yoshida's house No. 8. "In my house I put all kind of things. I cannot write it all and in No. 8 I put a number

of boxes full of trolling equipment."

(2) The "trolling machine" was evidently an 8 spool gurdy left near Yoshikazu Kawaguchi's house at Bamfield.

We comment on this as follows.

(1) Further reference to our Victoria Agent's list, our file 6/66, shows the following turned over to the Navy in Iwakichi Yoshida's name.

- 1 Tub lead 80 lbs.
- 2 Boxes lead line 180 lbs.
- 1 Box fishing gear

We have no record of anything having been moved from Port Albion in Mr. Nishi's name. Correspondence in January 1944 seems to indicate, however, that Mr. Thompson of the Uelualet Engineering Works may have been given some or all of Mr. Nishi's fishing equipment in payment of a claim against him.

(2) Turning to gurdies, our Victoria Agent's list of equipment turned over to the Navy at Bamfield shows the following.




