I note from Mr. Moryson's report of March 12th that these tools were stolen presumably sometime between October 2nd when the inventory was taken and Mr. Moryson's visit in March. I quite realize that Mr. Moryson visited the premises the earliest possible opportunity after our conversation of January 30th and my memorandum of February 1st, having regard to the very large territory your fieldmen have to cover, but I think that a statement to this effect should appear on the file. This will prove that we did what we could to protect this man's effects.

Wherever there is any possibility of stolen property being traced and identified by the police, I think the fieldmen should report thefts and house-breakings to the police and so state in their report to this office.

There is a list of missing articles on file which should be clarified. I think for instance the sewing machine and farming tools are worth while value to make further inquiries on.

The history shows that Lundstrom & Smith had the original lease which included use of farm implements. They apparently sub-leased to Wm. Bell.

File shows that on Oct 9/43 Matsuo asked for shipment of a sewing machine and trunk - was this actually shipped or is it missing? *Shipped Oct 9/43*

It is stated on the release that the Storekeeper has the key. (This might be to the house or the trunk.)

Mrs. N. Amadatsu also had some effects at this place and she also declares a sewing machine.

Finally, although the file shows that pilfering had occurred, there is no definite report about it, and Lundstrom & Smith, and W. Bell should be questioned as to their responsibility.

Mr. AMADATSU left his effects on the Dannison Road property, Mt. Lebanon, and there is an inventory on both his file, No. 4410 and on MATSUO's file, No. 4522, covering both of their effects. There is a letter on File 4522, dated May 21st from MATSUO however, in which he states that the only property of the AMADATSUS left at his place consisted of one double bed, one single bed, and three boxes of mechanic's tools. MATSUO in this letter also confirms receiving the shipment referred to in our memo of May 15th on all files, and as it appears on the files that the MATSUO property was vacant and a great many of the effects stolen, it may be assumed that recovery of chattels is covered by our sales sheets dated May 17th, 1944, on which none of AMADATSU's goods are shown. Files 4410 and 5382 can therefore be considered complete insofar as chattels are concerned.

File 4522 awaits further report from Mr. Anderson.

We are assuming too, that the sewing machine declared by Mrs. AMADATSU was the same one declared by MATSUO.

Further to memorandum of November 27 on Files 4522 and 4410, it appears that according to information received from the U. S. Security Commission, that a sewing machine, trunk, baby bed, etc. called for on releases dated Oct. 9, 1943 and March 23, 1944, were shipped on Nov. 15, 1943 and May 12, 1944 respectively.

A report from Mr. R. H. Anderson relative to Messrs. Lundstrom, Smith and W. Bell, is attached hereto.
