On Dec. 1st, 1939 I recovered a Judgment in the County Court of Westminster holden at New Yestmingter for the sum of \$240.00 and costs which were subsequently taxed and allowed in the sum of \$41.20. In this action Torao Amemori was the Plaintiff(Judgment Oreditor) and Rimio Ikebuchi (otherwise known as Jonny Ikebuchi) was the Defendant (Judgment Debtor).

I was unable to recover anything on this judgment other than one payment of \$2.00. Subsequent judgment summons proceedings were taken against the judgment debtor and he was ordered to pay the judgment at the rate of \$10.00 per month. No payments were made by Ikebuchi under this order other than the one payment of \$2.00.

I might say in explanation that some 3 or 4 years ago I was instructed to bring an action against the S. C. Motor Transportation Company for damages arising out a collision between a motor bus and a motor car owned by Torac Amemori which occurred near Mission. At the time it looked as though my client and his wife and daughter had a fairly sunstantial claim. A writ was issued in the Supreme Court of B. C., examinations were held and a careful investigation made of the whole matter and I became convinced that we could not possibly succeed on our action and very small settlement was made on a "nuisance" basis so as to make a small payment to each of the creditors and parties interested in the settlement. I have your letter of the 23rd. instant enquiring about the above matter and beg to advise you that the transactions in regard to the above party occurred several years ago and some of my earlier records have been mislaid or destroyed.

My recollections, however, in regard to this matter is quite clear and an action was brought by me in the Supreme Court on behalf of the above party against the B. C. Motor Transportation Limited for damages arising out of a traffic accident that happened near Mission, B. C.

The claim was vigorously opposed by the Defendant and examinations were held and preparations were made for trial. After checking the matter very careful with the witnesses I was satisfied that the accident was due very largely to the negligence of my own client. The claim was finally settled before trial for \$200.00 on a "NUISANCE" bases and a complete settlement was made with the above party at the time and I settled all matters in connection with that action.

About the same time I was instructed by the above party to bring another action against one Ikebuchi and after trial I secured a judgment against him and was unable to realize anything on same.

As re the Account of Drs. Hodgins & Hatfield I have no knowledge whatever of same.

This account was certainly not turned into me at the time and I never at any time undertook to pay same.
