We would have not dealt this up in court if he had been a bit more reasonable and explained how things were but instead he would just try to get away with everything. He certainly has nerves to say he had no chance to fight his way at court. We had been very patient with him and was very willing to make things very easy for him as well only he avoided everything by sneaking away and telling lies so much.

It is our desire to see that the right is fulfilled and Mr. Ikabuchi should have every intention to pay us.

I advise you to see our lawyer Mr. A.C. Skelving of 218 Rogers Bldg., I am certain he has the copy of the claim as well as the ones I have already given into the Custodian which is legal.

The Pacific Stage Claim Department has nothing to do of this. They paid us to cover damage of our car. Mr. Rimes Skebuchi was to repair it for us instead he kept telling us he needed this and that of the parts to the car etc. In fact we paid him some money so he can get the parts for our car. Always he had some excuses of some kind until we heard rumours of parts of our car being sold little by little. We investigated and found that our car motor had been sold to Mr. Blackburn without our consent and bits of this and that had been sold making it complicated to trace it. Now, may I ask you would any honest person sell another's property and pretend all along he was repairing it? Can they get away with things so easily as this? We have every right to fight this through I'm sure & he has absolutely no right to deny paying us for all the trouble and expense it has cost us.

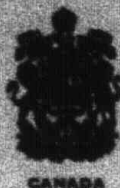

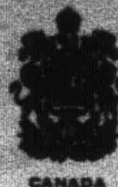



We have for acknowledgment yours of the 3rd instant regarding the above, and we wish to thank your Lethbridge Representative for the information supplied. We have paid the two claims authorized by Mrs. AMEMORI, namely, Dr. J. S. Madill - \$125.00 and Dr. C. E. Brown - \$25.00.

With regard to the last part of the Lethbridge report, the Routledge Motors Ltd. claim is a Judgment claim and is for the unpaid balance of account. It has been previously acknowledged as correct by, Torao AMEMORI, her husband.

As to the Drs. Hodgins and Hatfield claim of \$40.00, which Mrs. AMEMORI admits as correct, the claim is definitely against AMEMORI even although the Court Judgment was in their favour with regard to their claim against IKENUCHI. Our understanding is that AMEMORI employed the Doctors, therefore, they are responsible for the claim. They should pay the claim and then collect from IKENUCHI. From IKENUCHI'S file it is evident that he has not settled with Mr. Skaling, AMEMORI'S Lawyer, for the Court Judgment which was given against him. 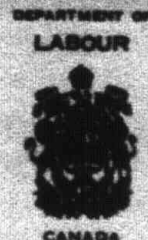



In reply to your letter of October 10/44, I contacted these people again, and I find that there is apparently quite a misunderstanding in your office of this case, as the person, Mr. Ikehuchi does not enter into this case at all.

From the explanation which I got from Mr. Anmeri, it appears that the bus running from Mission to Vancouver ran into their car, damaging it and injuring the occupants, and that Mr. Shaling, a lawyer in Vancouver, was employed to take action against the busline and sue them for damages, and judgment was given in favour of Mr. Anmeri against the bus line for this claim, and Mr. Shaling was to collect this money and pay the Doctors, giving an account to Mr. Anmeri of all transactions, and up to date he apparently has not done this, but Mr. Anmeri claims that Drs. Hodgins & Hatfield should collect their \$40.00 from Mr. Shaling as they have information, they state, that Mr. Shaling collected this money from the Bus Co.

It might be in order to explain from the version they give me, and how apparently Mr. Ikehuchi enters into this case with Mr. Shaling. After the accident Mr. Anmeri placed the red car in the hands of Mr. Ikehuchi for repairs, but instead of Mr. Ikehuchi repairing the car, he tore it to pieces and sold the car, and Mr. Anmeri then had to hire Mr. Shaling to sue Mr. Ikehuchi for this car, and Mr. Anmeri states this last transaction had nothing to do with the first claim. Anmeri claims that Mr. Ikehuchi should not be brought into this at all.

Trusting you may be able to get a statement of the first transaction from Mr. Shaling, and be able to settle the Drs. account from monies which he should have turned in.

I have your letter of the 23rd. instant enquiring about the above matter and beg to advise you that the transactions in regard to the above party occurred several years ago and some of my earlier records have been mislaid or destroyed.

My recollections, however, in regard to this matter is quite clear and an action was brought by me in the Supreme Court on behalf of the above party against the B. C. Motor Transportation Limited for damages arising out of a traffic accident that happened near Mission, B. C.

The claim was vigorously opposed by the Defendant and examinations were held and preparations were made for trial. After checking the matter very careful with the witnesses I was satisfied that the accident was due very largely to the negligence of my own client. The claim was finally settled before trial for \$200.00 on a "NUISANCE" basis and a complete settlement was made with the above party at the time and I settled all matters in connection with that action.

About the same time I was instructed by the above party to bring another action against one Ikebuchi and after trial I secured a judgment against him and was unable to realize anything on same.

As re the Account of Drs. Hodgins & Hatfield I have no knowledge whatever of same.

THIS account was certainly not turned into me at the time and I never at any time undertook to pay same. I doubt very much if this particular account has any bearing whatever on the action that I brought against the B. C. Motor Transportation Limited.

As a matter of fact Amemori is still indebted to me for approximately \$50.00 for costs in connection with the costs re the Ikebuchi action, but I am not pressing this claim in view of the fact that we were unable to realize anything on this claim.

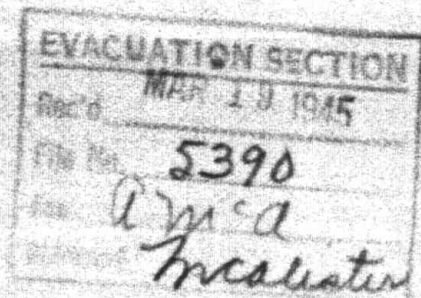
