Pursuant to your instructions of the 28th ult., our representative proceeded to the above address, interviewed Mr. Gondo and prepared a report on the position of affairs. Resultant details are shown below in the order given in your instructions re filing of Agents' reports.

REAL ESTATE AND PERSONAL PROPERTY

1. Location and nature of property:

Realty:

The subject party advised that he does not own any real estate and none has yet been disclosed as a result of our investigation.

Nature of personal property:

All the personal property said to belong to K. Gondo is the stock of merchandise and fixtures located at 660 Kingsway E., Vancouver, B.C.

2. Particulars of ownership:

Although title to the personal property has not been verified the declarant claims to be sole owner, subject to a lien in the amount of \$132.00, held by the Coca Cola Company, Ltd.

3. Description of land and buildings:

No details are applicable in this instance.

4. Inventory of contents of building:

Contents of the store premises, said to be owned by his wife, Mrs. Tosoki Gondo, have not yet been listed as the business is still being operated.

5. Insurance in force:

Life:

Our representative was advised that Mr. K. Gondo does not carry any life insurance.

6. Particulars of liabilities:

No liabilities affecting the personal property have been disclosed as yet, with exception of the items mentioned under "Business", below.

BUSINESS

1. Location and nature of business:

Location of business:

660 Kingsway, Vancouver, B.C.

Nature of business:

Confectionery, Grocery, Tobacco and Crockery store, trading under the name of "Junction Confectionery."

2. Particulars of ownership:

We have been unable to substantiate title, although Gondo claims to be sole owner and records brought to our attention indicate that status.

3. Statement of assets and liabilities:

As the business is still being operated by the declarant we did not prepare an inventory of the stock and fixtures. However, a list recently completed by Gondo, values the stock at \$854.50, and the fixtures at \$991.05. As the stock was taken at retail prices, a reduction of approximately 20% would indicate the cost value. Our representative was of the opinion that the fixtures were highly valued as it was believed the depreciated cost would be roughly \$500.00. At that the indicated figure does not necessarily represent the resale value.

Gondo claims his only liability is \$132.00 owing the Coca Cola Co. Ltd. against one of their coolers. He also intimated that current light and telephone bills had not been paid at the time of our investigation. Efforts to obtain further information regarding any outstanding accounts are being made, and in the meantime, we have requested the Provincial and Dominion Governments to provide clearances respecting any amounts owing their several departments.

4. Particulars of insurance in force:

Fire:

Although the JP form indicates there is no insurance in force, we have learned during the course of our investigation that there was a policy written by the Bankers and Traders Insurance Co. It is Policy No. 32-28734 for \$1500 on the stock and fixtures indicated above, with loss payable to K. Gondo. The policy which is in our possession expires on April 6, 1943. Premiums paid in full.

5. Contracts affecting business:

No contracts affecting the business were discovered during the course of our investigation.

6. Prospects for continued operation of business:

As indicated above, the business is being continued at present by Mr. K. Gondo and as the store is well located, near the corner of Kingsway and Fraser Avenue, it is considered that little difficulty would be experienced in finding a party prepared to purchase the undertaking as a going concern.

7. General remarks:

As Gondo is said to be 62 years of age, it is believed his evacuation may be deferred. It appeared at the date of our investigation that he was unaware of definite time having been set in that connection. Meanwhile, he is endeavouring to sell the business. We have informed him that all offers must receive approval of the Custodian before consummation.

We have also requested the declarant, to advise us immediately on receipt of evacuation orders, so that necessary steps may be taken for preservation of all interests concerned.


RECOMMENDATIONS



With reference to yours of the 20th inst., we beg to advise that Mr. Gondo informed us of his impending departure on May 19th, 1942, and provided us with authority to dispose of his business assets located at 660 Kingsway, Vancouver, B.C. Copy of the signed authority is enclosed for your file.

Our representative prepared an inventory on May 21st, 1942, showing the following valuations:

Stock of merchandise	\$ 213.72
Fixtures	<u>124.20</u>
<u>Total</u>	<u>\$ 337.92</u>

Although we did not have an inventory prepared at the time of filing our original report, it is apparent that Gondo sold most of the marketable merchandise and numerous items of equipment before leaving the premises. The greater part of the remaining merchandise consists chiefly of Japanese crockery, toys and commodities for which there is little demand in Vancouver at the present time.

As indicated in our previous report, Gondo advised at that time that his only liability was \$132.00 owing the Coca Cola Company, covering which they held a lien against a cooler valued at roughly \$180.00. We have since learned, however, that the Arctic Ice Cream Co. Ltd., claim \$166.52 on a lien contract covering a 6 hole ice cream cabinet. As it is unlikely the latter item is worth more than the lien, it would appear Gondo has no equity. In addition to those liabilities, it is expected claims will be filed by the Telephone and Light companies.

As mentioned previously, the premises occupied by Gondo, were said to be the property of his wife, Mrs. Seki Gondo. In that connection we have been advised that she gave Mr. W. F. Gurd, Solicitor, of 623 Rogers Building, Vancouver, B.C., a Power of Attorney to administer affairs during her absence from the City. In that connection it is reported that Mrs. Gondo owes \$269.71 in taxes and it is Mr. Gondo's wish that any proceeds arising from a sale of his business assets be applied in payment thereof. Signed

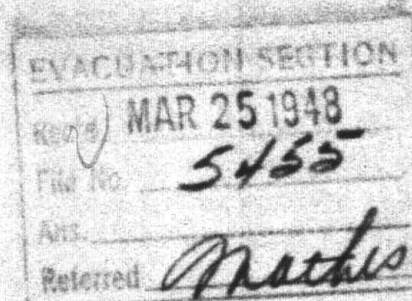
