This file reveals Tomewichi TOREKURA did not own any real property in any protected area of B.C. and did not carry any fire Insurance.

CHATTELS: Tomekichi Yonkkura made his declaration to the Custodian on April 3/42 and declared one fishing vessel and household goods.

The household goods declared by him are exactly the same as those declared by his wife, with the exception that she adds a sewing machine to her list. These were inventoried in the name of Mrs YOREKURA and the net proceeds in the sum of \$80.85, were credited to her account and this sum remitted to her through the Dept of Labour on September 25/46.

The heater requested in Custodian release of Aug 1/42 was shipped on Sept 11/42.

Dear Sirt

Your communications relative to the sum of \$639.00 which appears in your account with the Custodian have been received. The matter of releasing these funds to you at the present time has been discussed with the B. C. Security Commission.

It appears that before evacuation you were engaged in the fishing business as a member of your family. The fishing vessel was registered in the name of your father and it is only reasonable that some at least of the nets and lishing equipment actually belonged to him notwithstanding that you declared them on April 24, 1942 to the Custodian.

as you know both residing at Slocan and have apparently exhausted their resources. While they naturally do not wish to be a burden upon you for maintenance, in the event of the goods above mentioned being at least jointly owned by them, we feel sure that you would desire to have a proper share devoted to their use. We note from your record that you are gainfully employed in Toronte and we would be glad to hear from you as to your position in this matter. of Personal Property Claim (also Extracts of Credits from sales to Imperial Cannery dated Jan. 19, 1943), the full amount of the Estimated Value by Claimant was not always obtained from the Cannery in their purchases through the Custodian.
