PERSONAL PROPERTY SUMMARY

May 29, 1946.

Re: Jingo TANAKA, Registration No. 09312

This man signed a declaration to the Custodian on April 24, 1942. He was evacuated on April 28, 1942.

In his declaration he reported a trunk of personal effects and a box of tools at Hillcrest, B.C. The box of tools was sent to him in May, 1942 and the trunk was shipped in May, 1943.

In his declaration he reported a \$50.00 Victory Bond and \$40.00 in War Savings Certificates in his own possession. These did not come under the control of this office.

The account of this man was credited with the sum of \$3.96 as refund of 1% wage deductions for 1941. This amount was remitted to him on March 2, 1944.

This man had an insurance policy with five other Japanese on their goods stored at Hillcrest. This was cancelled when his goods were shipped. This did not come under the control of this office.

This file reveals no other property of any kind.

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
