

Without cashing the cheque, I left Canada on June 1946. Upon arriving in Japan, my wallet which contained the cheque was stolen. In as such as this incident happened about three and a half (38) years ago. I did not expect to be able to communicate with you in this matter, but I would appreciate it if you could check your back records to see if this check had been returned to you. As this money would be of great help to me if I could get it back. If the cheque had not been returned to you, I would like to have another cheque written, and the first cancelled, so that I can cash it in the Bank of Tokyo who handles foreign money. Dear Sir: As requested by you through our representative, Mr. Good, we enclose herewith a statement of your account which shows a total credit balance of \$78.65 standing to your credit in this office. Your file has been reviewed and it is noted that when you made your declaration to the Gustodian on April 24th, 1942, you declared nets and household effects stored at House #45, Phoenix Cannery. In an undated letter received in this office on February 23rd, 1943, you enclosed a supplementary list of nets and household effects stored at House \$45, Phoenix Cannery and the Phoenix Cannery net house, which you had not declared previously. All nets found at the Cannery net house and identified as belonging to you, were sold for the sum of \$77.00, and this sum credited to your account with the Custodian. You were advised of this in our letter of March 8th, 1943. No nets or fishing equipment were found in House #45 when our Steveston representative moved everything from this house to our storage warehouse. On March 20th, 1943, you sent us a Custodian Release requesting shipment of some goods, of which only one trunk and one box of dishes were located and shipped to you on September 27th, 1943. Other chattels were sold for the net sum of \$1.65, and this sum was credited to your account with this office. The Philco radio which you had surrendered to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police was sold for the net sum of \$31.45, and at the request of the Department of Labour, a Custodian cheque for this amount was remitted to you on February 6th, 1946. According to information supplied to this office your fishing vessel, the "S.O." was sold through the Japanese Fishing Vessel Disposal Committee for the net sum of \$789.50, and this sum was paid to you on May 6th, 1942.
